Mr. Speaker,

The Government Operations Committee reports a favorable recommendation on **H.B. 114**, EMERGENCY EXECUTIVE POWERS AMENDMENTS, by Representative A. Stoddard, with the following amendments:

- 1. Page 1, Lines 11 through 13:
 - 11 This bill:
 - 12 { reduces } amends the amount the governor may spend for an emergency procurement during
 - an epidemic or pandemic <u>before notice has to be provided to the Legislature</u>;
- 2. *Page 2, Lines 50 through 56:*
 - 50 (1) Notwithstanding any other provision of this chapter, a procurement official may
 - authorize a procurement unit to engage in an emergency procurement without using a standard
 - 52 procurement process if the procurement is necessary to:
 - (a) avoid a lapse in a critical government service;
 - (b) mitigate a circumstance that is likely to [have a negative impact on] cause
 - 55 {<u>irreparable</u>} <u>substantial</u> <u>harm to public health, safety, welfare, or property; or</u>
 - (c) protect the legal interests of a public entity.
- 3. Page 2, Line 57 through Page 3, Line 63:
 - 57 (2) A procurement unit conducting an emergency procurement under Subsection (1)
 - 58 shall:
 - 59 (a) ensure that the procurement is made with as much competition as reasonably

- (i) avoiding a lapse in a critical government service;
