The Health and Human Services Committee recommends **S.B. 28**, PHYSICIAN ASSISTANT MENTAL HEALTH PRACTICE AMENDMENTS, by Senator C. S. Bramble, be replaced and reports a favorable recommendation on **1st Sub. S.B. 28**, PHYSICIAN ASSISTANT MENTAL HEALTH PRACTICE AMENDMENTS with the following amendments:

1.	Page	14,	Line	425	through	n Page	15,	Line	45	1.
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- 425 (a) meets the requirements described in Subsections 58-70a-501.1(1)(a) through (c);
- 426 {<u>and</u>}
- 427 (b) engages in the practice of mental health therapy {-in collaboration with
 - under the supervision of :
- 428 (i) a physician assistant specializing in psychiatric mental health; or
- 429 (ii) a physician who is board certified in psychiatry {...} ; and
 - (c) engages in the practice of mental health therapy in accordance with rules made by the division regarding the supervision described in Subsection (9)(b).
- 430 {<u>(10) (a) A physician assistant who does not specialize in psychiatric mental</u> health may
- 431 <u>provide mental health therapy as defined in Section 58-60-102 if the physician</u>
 <u>assistant enters</u>
- 432 <u>into a collaborative practice agreement with:</u>
- 433 <u>(i) a psychiatrist; or</u>
- 434 (ii) a physician assistant specializing in psychiatric mental health.
- 435 (b) A physician assistant who provides mental health therapy under

436	<u>(i) may provide psychoeducation and limited supportive counseling:</u>
437	(A) as part of a health care team; and
438	(B) in accordance with the physician assistant's collaborative practice
	agreement;
439	<u>(ii) may not practice independently or provide formal psychotherapy;</u>
440	<u>(iii) shall maintain a formal collaborative agreement at the practice that</u>
	describes the
441	scope of services that may be provided by the physician assistant; and
442	(iv) shall make the collaborative agreement available to the division or the
	board upon
443	request by the division or the board.
444	(c) A physician assistant who practices in a non-psychiatric setting may
	provide mental
445	health therapy as defined in Section 58-60-102, including psychoeducation and
	<u>limited</u>
446	supportive counseling, if:
447	(i) the services are consistent with:
448	(A) customary and accepted practices for the physician assistant's practice
	setting;
449	(B) the physician assistant's education, training, and experience; and
450	(C) applicable standards of care; and
451	(ii) the physician assistant does not provide formal psychotherapy.
