PHARMACY PRACTICE REVISIONS

Representative **Paul Ray** proposes the following amendments:

1. Page 18, Lines 547 through 550:

547 (ii) for an audit that requires an on-site visit at a pharmacy, the date on which the
548 auditing entity completes the on-site visit. ~~{which may not:}~~ including any follow-up visits or
analysis which shall be completed within 60 days after the days on which the on-site visit begins.
{549 ~~(A) include any follow-up visits or analysis; and~~
550 ~~(B) exceed 48 hours after the auditing entity arrives on-site at the pharmacy.}~~}

2. Page 21, Lines 615 through 619:

Subsection (6)(b).

4. Page 21, Lines 641 through 642:

5. Page 22, Lines 652 through 654:

652 (a) the pharmacy to resubmit a claim using any commercially reasonable method,

654 **claim may be resubmitted has not expired under the rules of the plan sponsor** {+} [-]; and
