Section 1. Section 11-46-401 is enacted to read:

Part 4. Retail Pet Store Regulation

<u>11-46-401.</u> Definitions -- Limitations on pet store regulations.

(1) As used in this part, "retail pet store" means a place of business within a political subdivision where a seller, buyer, and an animal for sale as a pet are physically present so that a buyer may personally observe the animal prior to purchasing.

(2) A political subdivision may not make or enforce an ordinance or other regulation that {requires}prohibits a retail pet store {to only sell an animal that was obtained from an animal shelter or similar entity.

from selling an animal based on the source from which the animal is obtained if the source is in compliance with the Animal Welfare Act, 7 U.S.C. Sec. 2131 et seq.
