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Be it enacted by the Legislature of the state of Utah:
Section 1. Section 26-18-427 is enacted to read:
<u>26-18-427.</u> Wraparound services for qualified individuals with a disability.
(1) As used in this section:
(a) "Federal poverty level" means the same as that term is defined in Section
<u>26-18-411.</u>
(b) "Minimum essential coverage" means the same as that term is defined in 26 U.S.C
<u>Sec. 5000A.</u>
(c) "Qualified individual" means an individual who:
(i) is a disabled individual as defined in 42 U.S.C. Sec. 1382c;
(ii) within the past 12 months has been enrolled in the state Medicaid program;
(iii) is enrolled in minimum essential coverage other than the Medicaid program;
(iv) except as provided in Subsections (1)(c)(v) and (vi), does not meet the income or
asset requirements for enrollment in the state Medicaid program;
(v) has a household income that is less than or equal to 500% of the federal poverty
level; and
(vi) has assets, excluding one home and one automobile, that are valued at less than
<u>\$150,000.</u>
(d) "Wraparound services" means services and benefits that:
(i) are covered by the Medicaid program; and
(ii) are not covered by the minimum essential coverage described in Subsection
<u>(1)(c)(iii).</u>
(2) Before July 1, 2022, the division shall apply for a Medicaid waiver with CMS to
provide wraparound services to qualified individuals:
(a) as state funding permits; and
(b) in a manner that requires qualified individuals to make cost sharing payments
according to a sliding scale established by the department for services received under this
section.
(3) (a) The sliding scale established by the department under Subsection (2)(b) shall
be:

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59	(i) based on household income; and
60	(ii) shall be used to determine the percentage of the cost of a wraparound service that a
61	qualified individual is required to pay.
62	(b) The percentage of the cost of a wraparound service that a qualified individual is
63	required to pay:
64	(i) may not exceed 0% for a qualified individual with a household income less than or
65	<u>equal to \$15,000;</u>
66	(ii) may not be less than 100% for a qualified individual with a household income
67	greater than \$125,000; and
68	(iii) for qualified individuals with a household income greater than \$15,000 and less
69	than or equal to \$125,000, shall be determined according to income categories established by
70	the department as provided in Subsection (4).
71	(c) Notwithstanding Subsection (3)(b), the amount paid by a qualified individual under
72	Subsection (3)(b) may not exceed:
73	(i) \$40 per month for a qualified individual with a household income less than or equal
74	<u>to \$15,000;</u>
75	(ii) \$2,900 per month for a qualified individual with a household income greater than
76	<u>\$125,000; and</u>
77	(iii) for qualified individuals with a household income greater than \$15,000 and less
78	than or equal to \$125,000, an amount determined according to income categories established
79	by the department as provided in Subsection (4).
80	(4) The department makes rules in accordance with Title 63G, Chapter 3, Utah
81	Administrative Rulemaking Act, to establish the income categories, percentages, and
82	maximum payment amounts described in Subsection (3).
83	(5) If a waiver or state plan amendment described in Subsection (2) is approved, the
84	department shall provide wraparound services in accordance with this section.
