LONG TITLE

General Description:

This bill creates the Trauma-informed Research and Training Grant Program.

Highlighted Provisions:

This bill:

- ▶ defines terms;
- ▶ creates the Trauma-informed Research and Training Grant Program within the Department of Workforce Services;
- ▶ creates reporting requirements;
- ▶ provides a sunset date; and
- ▶ makes technical and conforming changes.

Money Appropriated in this Bill:

This bill appropriates in fiscal year 2023:

- ▶ to Department of Workforce Services -- Operations and Policy -- Workforce Development, as a one-time appropriation:
 - From General Fund, One-time, \$2,000,000.

32 *Be it enacted by the Legislature of the state of Utah:*

33 Section 1. Section **35A-1-601** is enacted to read:

34 **Part 6. Department Grant Programs**

35 **35A-1-601. Trauma-informed Research and Training Grant Program.**

36 (1) As used in this section:

37 (a) "Program" means a statewide program described in Subsection (2).

38 (b) "Traumatic life experience" means a life event or set of circumstances that:

39 (i) a child or adult experiences as physically or emotionally harmful or life threatening;

40 and

41 (ii) has lasting adverse effects on the child's or adult's functioning or physical,

42 emotional, mental, social, or spiritual well-being.

43 (2) There is created the Trauma-informed Research and Training Grant Program to
44 award a grant for implementation of a statewide program to prevent and mitigate the impact of
45 traumatic life experiences on state communities by:

46 (a) researching the economic and workforce impacts of traumatic life experiences on
47 state communities;

48 (b) based on the research described in Subsection (2)(a), providing workforce
49 education and training on the impact of traumatic life experiences and processes for building
50 and evaluating trauma-informed organizations to:

51 (i) state and local agencies, including:

52 (A) public and higher education systems;

53 (B) law enforcement; and

54 (C) courts of this state; and

55 (ii) health care systems;

56 (c) supporting local agencies in providing the education and training described in
57 Subsection (2)(b) to local communities; and

58 (d) developing an online data visualization portal that provides access to:

59 (i) the research described in Subsection (2)(a);
60 (ii) the availability and locations of trauma-informed services in state communities;
61 and
62 (iii) tools for successful mitigation and prevention of the impact of a traumatic life
63 experience.
64 (3) (a) A political subdivision, institution of higher education, or not for profit
65 organization may submit a proposal to the department for a grant to implement a program.
66 (b) A proposal described in Subsection (3)(a) shall:
67 (i) describe the social, economic, and workforce benefits of research and prevention of
68 traumatic life experiences; and
69 (ii) provide details regarding:
70 (A) how the political subdivision, institution of higher education, or not for profit
71 organization plans to implement the program; and
72 (B) any plan to use funding sources in addition to a grant awarded under this section
73 for the program.
74 (4) In evaluating a proposal under Subsection (3) to determine the grant award under
75 this section, the department shall consider:
76 (a) how the political subdivision, institution of higher education, or not for profit
77 organization will ensure effective administration of the program;
78 (b) the extent to which any additional funding sources described in the proposal are
79 likely to benefit the program; and
80 (c) the sustainability of the proposal.
81 (5) Before July 1, 2024, the department shall provide a written report to the Economic
82 Development and Workforce Services Interim Committee regarding:
83 (a) data gathered in relation to the programs for which a grant is awarded under this
84 section; and
85 (b) recommendations for increased prevention and mitigation of the impact of
86 traumatic life experiences, on state communities.

88 **63I-1-235. Repeal dates, Title 35A.**
89 (1) Subsection **35A-1-202(2)(d)**, related to the Child Care Advisory Committee, is

90 repealed July 1, 2026.

91 (2) Section 35A-1-601, regarding the Trauma-informed Research and Training Grant
92 Program, is repealed December 31, 2024.

93 [~~2~~] (3) Section 35A-3-205, which creates the Child Care Advisory Committee, is
94 repealed July 1, 2026.

95 [~~3~~] (4) Subsection 35A-4-312(5)(p), describing information that may be disclosed to
96 the federal Wage and Hour Division, is repealed July 1, 2022.

97 [~~4~~] (5) Subsection 35A-4-502(5), which creates the Employment Advisory Council,
98 is repealed July 1, 2022.

99 [~~5~~] (6) Title 35A, Chapter 8, Part 22, Commission on Housing Affordability, is
100 repealed July 1, 2023.

101 [~~6~~] (7) Section 35A-9-501 is repealed January 1, 2023.

102 [~~7~~] (8) Title 35A, Chapter 11, Women in the Economy Commission Act, is repealed
103 January 1, 2025.

104 [~~8~~] (9) Sections 35A-13-301 and 35A-13-302, which create the Governor's
105 Committee on Employment of People with Disabilities, are repealed July 1, 2023.

106 [~~9~~] (10) Section 35A-13-303, which creates the State Rehabilitation Advisory
107 Council, is repealed July 1, 2024.

108 [~~10~~] (11) Section 35A-13-404, which creates the advisory council for the Division of
109 Services for the Blind and Visually Impaired, is repealed July 1, 2025.

110 [~~11~~] (12) Sections 35A-13-603 and 35A-13-604, which create the Interpreter
111 Certification Board, are repealed July 1, 2026.

112 **Section 3. Appropriation.**

113 The following sums of money are appropriated for the fiscal year beginning July 1,
114 2022, and ending July 22, 2023. These are additions to amounts previously appropriated for
115 fiscal year 2023. Under the terms and conditions of Title 63J, Chapter 1, Budgetary Procedures
116 Act, the Legislature appropriates the following sums of money from the funds or accounts
117 indicated for the use and support of the government of the state of Utah.

120 From General Fund, One-time \$2,000,000

121 Schedule of Programs:

122 Workforce Development \$2,000,000

123 The Legislature intends that:

124 (1) the appropriations provided under this item be used to award grants under the

125 Trauma-informed Research and Training Grant Program created in Section [35A-1-601](#); and

126 (2) under Section [63J-1-603](#), the appropriations under this item not lapse at the close of

127 fiscal year 2023 and the use of any nonlapsing funds is limited to the purpose described in

128 Subsection (1) of this item.
