Be it enacted by the Legislature of the state of Utah:
Section 1. Section 26B-1-201 is amended to read:
26B-1-201. Department of Health and Human Services Creation Duties.
(1) There is created within state government the Department of Health and Human
Services, which has all of the policymaking functions, regulatory and enforcement powers,
rights, duties, and responsibilities outlined in this title.
[(2) In addition to Subsection (1), during the transition period described in Section
26B-1-201.1, the Department of Health and Human Services may exercise any of the
policymaking functions, regulatory and enforcement powers, rights, duties, and responsibilities
of the Department of Health and the Department of Human Services under the joint direction
of:]
[(a) the executive director of the Department of Health; and]
[(b) the executive director of the Department of Human Services.]
(2) (a) The chief administrative officer of the department is the executive director who
shall be appointed by the governor with the advice and consent of the Senate.
(b) The executive director shall serve at the pleasure of the governor.
(c) The governor shall establish the executive director's salary within the salary range
fixed by the Legislature in Title 67, Chapter 22, State Officer Compensation.
Section 2. Section 26B-1-202 is enacted to read:
<u>26B-1-202.</u> Divisions within the Department of Health and Human Services.
There is created within the department the following divisions:
(1) within the section on Operations:
(a) the Division of Finance and Administration, which shall include:
(i) the Office of Administrative Services;
