Public Utilities, Energy, and Technology Interim Committee; and
sets a repeal date for the commission.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the state of Utah:
Section 1. Section 36-29-109 is enacted to read:
36-29-109. Utah Broadband Center Advisory Commission.
(1) As used in this section:
(a) "Center" means the Utah Broadband Center created in Section 63N-17-201.
(b) "Commission" means the Utah Broadband Center Advisory Commission created in
Subsection (2).
(c) "Federal infrastructure funds" means the funds available to states pursuant to the
Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act, Pub. L. No. 115-58.
(d) "Strategic plan" means the statewide digital connectivity plan described in Section
<u>63N-17-203.</u>
(2) There is created the Utah Broadband Center Advisory Commission consisting of
the following nine voting members:
(a) two members of the Senate, appointed by the president of the Senate;
(b) two members of the House of Representatives, appointed by the speaker of the
House of Representatives;
(c) the executive director of the Governor's Office of Planning and Budget, or the
executive director's designee;
(d) the governor shall appoint four members who currently work in the public sector
and who have professional experience in:
(i) broadband or broadband infrastructure;
(ii) applying for federal grants; or

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59	(iii) financing infrastructure.
60	(3) In addition to the nine voting members, the director of the center, or the director's
61	designee, shall serve on the commission in a nonvoting capacity.
62	(4) (a) The president of the Senate shall designate one of the members described in
63	Subsection (2)(a) to serve as cochair of the commission.
64	(b) The speaker of the House of Representatives shall designate one of the members
65	described in Subsection (2)(b) to serve as cochair of the commission.
66	(5) (a) If a vacancy occurs in the membership of the commission, the member shall be
67	replaced in the same manner in which the original appointment was made.
68	(b) A member shall serve until the member's successor is appointed and qualified.
69	(6) (a) A majority of the members of the commission constitutes a quorum.
70	(b) The action of a majority of a quorum constitutes an action of the commission.
71	(7) (a) Salaries and expenses of the members of the commission who are legislators
72	shall be paid in accordance with:
73	(i) Section 36-2-2;
74	(ii) Legislative Joint Rules, Title 5, Chapter 2, Lodging, Meal, and Transportation
75	Expenses; and
76	(iii) Legislative Joint Rules, Title 5, Chapter 3, Legislator Compensation.
77	(b) A member of the commission who is not a legislator may not receive compensation
78	for the member's work associated with the commission but may receive per diem and
79	reimbursement for travel expenses incurred as a member of the commission at the rates
80	established by the Division of Finance under:
81	(i) Sections 63A-3-106 and 63A-3-107; and
82	(ii) rules made by the Division of Finance in accordance with Sections 63A-3-106 and
83	<u>63A-3-107.</u>
84	(8) The center shall provide staff support to the commission.
85	(9) The commission shall:
86	(a) make recommendations to the center with respect to:
87	(i) strategic plan development;
88	(ii) the application for and use of federal infrastructure funds;
89	(iii) the application for and use of other federal or state funds; and

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90	(iv) the application for and use of funds received or made available through legislative
91	appropriations;
92	(b) solicit input from relevant stakeholders, including:
93	(i) public and private entities who may assist in developing and implementing the
94	strategic plan; and
95	(ii) public and private entities whom the strategic plan may impact;
96	(c) provide recommendations for strategic plan development and implementation based
97	on the input described in Subsection (9)(b);
98	(d) review strategic plan drafts; and
99	(e) recommend changes.
100	(10) The commission shall meet as needed.

111	63N-17-201. Utah Broadband Center Creation Director Duties.
112	(1) There is created within the office the Utah Broadband Center.
113	(2) The executive director shall appoint a director of the broadband center to oversee
114	the operations of the broadband center.
115	(3) The broadband center shall:
116	(a) ensure that publicly funded broadband projects continue to be publicly accessible
117	and provide a public benefit;
118	(b) develop [a statewide digital connectivity plan] the statewide digital connectivity
119	plan described in Section 63N-17-203;
120	(c) carry out the duties described in Section 63N-17-202; and

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121	(d) administer the Broadband Access Grant Program in accordance with Part 3,
122	Broadband Access Grant Program.
123	Section 4. Section 63N-17-203 is enacted to read:
124	63N-17-203. Statewide digital connectivity plan.
125	(1) As used in this section:
126	(a) "Commission" means the Utah Broadband Center Advisory Commission created in
127	Section 36-29-109.
128	(b) "Strategic plan" means the statewide digital connectivity plan created in Subsection
129	<u>(2).</u>
130	(2) The center shall develop the statewide digital connectivity plan.
131	(3) The strategic plan shall include strategies to:
132	(a) implement broadband connectivity statewide;
133	(b) promote digital equity;
134	(c) apply for federal infrastructure funds; and
135	(d) apply for additional funds.
136	(4) In developing the strategic plan, the center shall work with the commission.
137	(5) The center shall provide the commission with status updates regarding:
138	(a) implementation of recommendations;
139	(b) strategic plan development;
140	(c) strategic plan implementation;
141	(d) grants received;
142	(e) projects funded; and
143	(f) recommendations for legislation.
144	(6) The center shall submit the strategic plan to the commission for the commission's
145	recommendation before finalizing the strategic plan.
146	(7) On or before November 30 of each year, the center shall report to the commission
147	and the Public Utilities, Energy, and Technology Interim Committee regarding the status
148	updates described in Subsection (5).
149	Section 5. Effective date.
150	If approved by two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, this bill takes effect
151	upon approval by the governor, or the day following the constitutional time limit of Utah
