Section 1. Section 49-20-422 is enacted to read:

(b) "Diagnosis of autism spectrum disorder" means the same as that term is defined in

Section 31A-22-642.

(c) "Eligible provider" means a provider who:

(i) provides behavioral health treatment:

(A) to a child with a diagnosis of autism spectrum disorder; and

(B) in-person at a physical location in a county of the third, fourth, fifth, or sixth class;

and and

(ii) is not a contracted provider with the program.

(2) For a plan year beginning on or after July 1, 2022, the program shall:

(a) treat an eligible provider as in-network for purposes of a covered individual's

coverage and cost-sharing requirements; and

(b) enter into a contract for the eligible provider's services with reimbursement to the eligible provider at a commercially competitive rate.
