Mr. President,

The Health and Human Services Committee reports a favorable recommendation on **S.B. 236**, PHARMACY PRACTICE AMENDMENTS, by Senator E. J. Vickers, with the following amendments:

- 1. Page 1, Lines 9 through 14:
 - 9 This bill amends the Pharmacy Practice Act { and the Insurance Code } .
 - 10 Highlighted Provisions:
 - 11 This bill: 12{ → prohibits an insurer or pharmacy benefit manager from asking a pharmacy or
 - 13 insured to disclose how a drug was paid for except to ensure compliance with state
 - 14 or federal law; }
- 2. Page 2, Lines 40 through 50:

- 43 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the state of Utah:

44{ Section 1. Section 31A-22-657 is enacted to read:

- 45 <u>31A-22-657.</u> Method of payment for drugs may not be requested.
- 46 <u>Except to ensure compliance with state or federal law, neither an insurer nor a</u>
- 47 <u>pharmacy benefit manager as defined in Section 31A-46-102 may ask a pharmacy or</u> <u>an</u>







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- 48 <u>enrollee of the insurer to disclose how a drug purchased from the pharmacy by the</u> <u>enrollee was</u>
- 49 <u>paid for, including whether payment was received from one or more persons other</u> <u>than the</u>
