31 its natural state, including canyons, parks owned or managed by the state, national parks, land
32 managed by the Bureau of Land Management, and other lands owned or maintained by a
33 government entity for outdoor recreational use.

34 (2) An individual is guilty of public lands vandalism if the individual creates, or assists
35 in creating, graffiti on any public lands or state-owned object permanently located on public
36 lands.

39 (4) If an individual is convicted of public lands vandalism, the court shall sentence the
40 individual to a term of community service as follows:

41 (a) for a first conviction, the court shall sentence the individual to 100 hours of
42 community service, to be completed within 90 days after the day on which the court issues the
43 order;

44 (b) for a second conviction, the court shall sentence the individual to 200 hours of
45 community service, to be completed within 180 days after the day on which the court issues the
46 order; or

47 (c) for a third or subsequent conviction, the court shall sentence the individual to 300
48 hours of community service, to be completed within 270 days after the day on which the court
49 issues the order.

50 (5) If an individual is enrolled in school or maintains full or part-time employment, the
51 ordered community service may not be scheduled at a time the individual is scheduled to be in
52 school or performing the individual's employment duties.

53 (6) A sentence of community service described in Subjection (4) shall, to the greatest
54 extent possible, be for the benefit of public lands.

55 (7) If an individual is convicted of public lands vandalism, the court may impose a fine
56 up to the full amount of the estimated cost to restore the damaged land, caused by the
57 individual, to the land's original state.
