| 40 | communities throughout the country have provided free meals, groceries, masks, and sanitizer, |
| 41 | etc. to many communities and organizations during the pandemic; |
| 42 | WHEREAS, Utah recognizes the cultural, religious, and interfaith importance of Shri |
| 43 | Guru Granth Sahib Ji as the "Living Guru" of Sikhs in promoting peace and declaring Sikhs as |
