This bill ~~{creates a grant program for expanded mobile crisis intervention teams to be administered by}~~requires the Division of Integrated Healthcare to establish a grant program to fund best practice crisis intervention teams.

Highlighted Provisions:

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the state of Utah:

Section 1. Section **26B-4-102** is enacted to read:

(1) As used in this section:

(a) "Best practice crisis intervention team" means a team ~~{of}~~ created under a best practice crisis intervention team program that:

(i) is comprised of law enforcement officers and mental health professionals certified by the division;

(f) "Mobile crisis outreach team" means the same as that term is defined in Section 62A-15-102.

(2) (a) The division shall establish and administer a grant program for local law enforcement agencies to create or expand a best practice crisis intervention program.

(b) A law enforcement agency awarded a grant under this section shall use the grant to assist best practice crisis intervention teams to respond to an incident upon request of a mobile crisis outreach team or if a mobile crisis outreach team is not available.

(3) A law enforcement agency that submits a proposal for a grant to the division shall include in the proposal:

(a) a plan for creating or expanding the law enforcement agency's best practice crisis intervention program;

(b) any funding sources in addition to the grant for the proposal;

(c) any existing or planned partnerships between the law enforcement agency and another entity to implement the proposal; and

(d) other information the division determines necessary to evaluate the proposal.

(4) The division:

(a) shall establish data tracking and reporting requirements for a local law enforcement agency ~~for local mental health authority~~ that receives a grant ~~through the program described in Subsection (2), which shall include~~ that includes:

(ii) (A) eligibility criteria for a grant;

(B) the form and process for submitting a proposal to the division for a grant;

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(C) the method and formula for determining a grant amount; and

(D) reporting requirements for a grant recipient.

Section 2. Appropriation.

The following sums of money are appropriated for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2023, and ending June 30, 2024. These are additions to amounts previously appropriated for fiscal year 2024. Under the terms and conditions of Title 63J, Chapter 1, Budgetary Procedures Act, the Legislature appropriates the following sums of money from the funds or accounts indicated for the use and support of the government of the state of Utah.
