8	General Description:
9	This bill establishes requirements for health care facilities related to patient visitation.
10	Highlighted Provisions:
11	This bill:
12	 requires health care facilities to allow a patient to see visitors under certain
13	circumstances;
14	 requires health care facilities to establish visitation policies;
15	 requires a health care facility to publish the health care facility's visitation policies;

17	requires the Department of Health and Human Services (department) to:
18	• publish information related to the visitation requirements on the department's
19	website; and
20	 provide a method for the public to report a violation to the department.

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29	Be it enacted by the Legislature of the state of Utah:
30	Section 1. Section 26-21-36 is enacted to read:
31	26-21-36. Visitation policy.
32	(1) As used in this section, "patient" means an individual who receives care or services
33	from a health care facility.
34	(2) A health care facility shall establish visitation policies and procedures that:
35	(a) may not:
36	(i) contain safety procedures that are more restrictive than the safety procedures the
37	health care facility requires of the health care facility's staff;
38	(ii) require a visitor to show proof of vaccination or immunization status;
39	(iii) prohibit physical contact between the visitor and the patient the visitor is visiting;
40	<u>and</u>
41	(b) shall, at a minimum, include provisions regarding:
42	(i) infection control;
43	(ii) infection control education for visitors;
44	(iii) personal protective equipment requirements when necessary for infection control;
45	(iv) for a visitor who is not a primary visitor as described in Subsection (3):
46	(A) maximum duration of visits;
47	(B) maximum number of visitors a patient may have each day;
48	(C) maximum number of visitors a patient may have at one time; and
49	(v) who at the health care facility is responsible for ensuring that staff adhere to the
50	policies and procedures; and
51	(c) shall allow a visitor to visit a patient unless visitation is denied or modified in
52	accordance with Subsection (4).
53	(3) (a) A patient may designate one individual as a primary visitor.
54	(b) Except as provided in Subsection (4), a health care facility may not limit the
55	duration or frequency of a primary visitor's visits to the designating patient.
56	(4) A health care facility may:
57	(a) require a visitor or a primary visitor to agree in writing to follow the health care
58	facility's visitation policies and procedures before allowing access to the patient;

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59	(b) suspend or refuse in-person visitation for a visitor or a primary visitor if the visitor
60	or primary visitor violates the health care facility's visitation policies and procedures;
61	(c) remove a visitor or primary visitor from the patient's vicinity for a short time if the
62	patient needs immediate life-saving care; and
63	(d) deny visitation for a visitor or primary visitor if:
64	(i) the patient objects to the visit; or
65	(ii) the patient is in an operating room.
66	(5) A health care facility shall provide the department with a copy of the health care
67	facility's visitation policies and procedures:
68	(a) upon the department's request; and
69	(b) when the health care facility:
70	(i) obtains a license to operate from the department;
71	(ii) renews the license from the department; and
72	(iii) changes ownership.
73	(6) A health care facility shall make visitation policies and procedures created in
74	accordance with this section available on the health care facility's website.
75	(7) The department shall provide:
76	(a) a description of the requirements of this section on the department's website; and
77	(b) a method for the public to report a violation of this section.
78	Section 2. Effective date.
79	This bill takes effect on July 1, 2023.
