33 (e) Utah Railroad Workers Day, on May 10;

34 (f) Dandy-Walker Syndrome Awareness Day, on May 11;

35 (g) Armed Forces Day, on the third Saturday in May, in honor of men and women who
36 are serving or have served in the United States Armed Forces around the world in defense of
37 freedom;

38 (h) Juneteenth Freedom Day, on the third Saturday in June, in honor of Union General
39 Gordon Granger proclaiming the freedom of all slaves on June 19, 1865, in Galveston, Texas;

40 (i) Arthrogyrosis Multiplex Congenita Awareness Day, on June 30;

41 (j) Navajo Code Talker Day, on August 14;

42 (k) Rachael Runyan/Missing and Exploited Children's Day, on August 26, the
43 anniversary of the day three-year-old Rachael Runyan was kidnaped from a playground in
44 Sunset, Utah, to:

45 (i) encourage individuals to make child safety a priority;

46 (ii) remember the importance of continued efforts to reunite missing children with their
47 families; and

48 (iii) honor Rachael Runyan and all Utah children who have been abducted or exploited;

49 (l) Constitution Day, on September 17, to invite all Utah school children to be taught
50 constitutional principles and read directly from the Constitution;

51 (m) POW/MIA Recognition Day, on the third Friday in September;

52 (n) Victims of Communism Memorial Day, on November 7;

53 (o) Indigenous People Day, on the Monday immediately preceding Thanksgiving; and

54 (p) Bill of Rights Day, on December 15.

55 (2) The Department of Veterans and Military Affairs shall coordinate activities, special
56 programs, and promotional information to heighten public awareness and involvement relating
57 to Subsections (1)(g) and (m).

58 (3) The month of April shall be commemorated annually as Clean Out the Medicine

59 Cabinet Month to:

60 (a) recognize the urgent need to make Utah homes and neighborhoods safe from
61 prescription medication abuse and poisonings by the proper home storage and disposal of
62 prescription and over-the-counter medications; and

63 (b) educate citizens about the permanent medication disposal sites in Utah listed on
64 useonlyasdirected.org that allow disposal throughout the year.

65 (4) The second full week of April shall be commemorated annually as Animal Care
66 and Control Appreciation Week to recognize and increase awareness within the community of
67 the services that animal care and control professionals provide.

68 (5) The first full week of May shall be commemorated annually as State Water Week
69 to recognize the importance of water conservation, quality, and supply in the state.

70 (6) The third full week of June shall be commemorated annually as Workplace Safety
71 Week to heighten public awareness regarding the importance of safety in the workplace.

72 (7) The second Friday and Saturday in August shall be commemorated annually as
73 Utah Fallen Heroes Days to:

74 (a) honor fallen heroes who, during service in the military or public safety, have
75 sacrificed their lives to protect the country and the citizens of the state; and

76 (b) encourage political subdivisions to acknowledge and honor fallen heroes.

77 (8) The third full week in August shall be commemorated annually as Drowsy Driving
78 Awareness Week to:

79 (a) educate the public about the relationship between fatigue and driving performance;
80 and

81 (b) encourage the Department of Public Safety and the Department of Transportation to
82 recognize and promote educational efforts on the dangers of drowsy driving.

83 (9) The month of September shall be commemorated annually as American Founders
84 Month to encourage all civic fraternal and religious organizations and public and private
85 educational institutions to recognize and observe this occasion through appropriate programs,
86 meetings, services, or celebrations in which state, county, and local governmental officials are
87 invited to participate.

89 Prevention Awareness Week.

91 Heritage Month.

96 (a) educate the public about avalanche awareness and safety;

99 (c) honor Utah residents who have lost their lives in avalanches, including those who
100 lost their lives working to prevent avalanches.
