This bill creates the Veterinarian Education Loan Repayment Program.

 specifies what a qualified veterinarian must do to be eligible for payment from the

 designates program funding as nonlapsing.

73	program permits, the program shall make a one-time payment to a qualified veterinarian on a
74	first-come, first-served basis in an amount equal to the least of:
75	(i) the sum of the qualified veterinarian's education loan balances;
76	(ii) \$100,000; or
77	(iii) unexpended funds appropriated to the program.
78	(b) A qualified veterinarian is eligible for payment from the program if the qualified
79	veterinarian:
80	(i) applies as a qualified veterinarian for payment from the program; and
81	(ii) registers with the program at least five years before the day the veterinarian applies

83	(3) The department may use 2% or less of the amount appropriated for the program to
