9	General Description:
10	This bill provides students attending private school, home school, charter school, and
11	online school a process for requesting participation in extracurricular activities outside
12	of the student's school of residence.

15	 defines terms;
16	 allows a private school student, a home school student, a charter school student, or
17	an online school student to participate in extracurricular activities outside of the
18	student's public school of residence under certain circumstances; and
19	 makes technical and conforming changes.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the state of Utah:
Section 1. Section 53G-6-703 is amended to read:
53G-6-703. Private school and home school students' participation in
extracurricular activities in a public school.
(1) As used in this section:
(a) "Academic eligibility requirements" means the academic eligibility requirements
that a home school student is required to meet to participate in an extracurricular activity in a
public school.
(b) "Extracurricular activity" means the same as that term is defined in Section
<u>53G-7-501</u>
[(b)] (c) "Minor" means the same as that term is defined in Section 53G-6-201.
[(c)] (d) "Parent" means the same as that term is defined in Section 53G-6-201.
[(d)] (e) "Principal" means the principal of the school in which a home school student
participates or intends to participate in an extracurricular activity.
(2) (a) A minor who is enrolled in a private school or a home school shall be eligible to
participate in an extracurricular activity at a public school as provided in this section.
(b) A private school student may only participate in an extracurricular activity at a
public school that is not offered by the student's private school.
(c) Except as provided in Subsection (2)(d), a private school student or a home school
student may only participate in an extracurricular activity at:
(i) the school [within whose] with attendance boundaries within which the student's
custodial parent resides; or
(ii) the school from which the student withdrew for the purpose of attending a private
or home school.
(d) A school other than a school described in Subsection (2)(c)(i) or (ii) may allow a
private school student or a home school student to participate in an extracurricular activity
[other than:] that the public school sponsors and supports if:
[(i) an interscholastic competition of athletic teams sponsored and supported by a
public school; or]

59	[(ii) an interscholastic contest or competition for music, drama, or forensic groups or
60	teams sponsored and supported by a public school].
61	(i) the private school student, subject to Subsection (2)(b), or the home school student
62	receives permission to participate in the extracurricular activity from the principals of:
63	(A) a public school described in Subsection (2)(c)(i) or (ii); and
64	(B) the public school in which the private school student or the home school student
65	intends to participate in the extracurricular activity; and
66	(ii) the private school student or the home school student meets the eligibility
67	requirements under this section.
68	(3) (a) Except as provided in Subsections (4) through (13), a private school student or \underline{a}
69	home school student shall be eligible to participate in an extracurricular activity at a public
70	school consistent with eligibility standards:
71	(i) applied to a fully enrolled public school student;
72	(ii) of the public school where the private school student or the home school student
73	participates in an extracurricular activity; and
74	(iii) for the extracurricular activity in which the private school or the home school
75	student participates.
76	(b) A school district or public school may not impose additional requirements on a
77	private school student or a home school student to participate in an extracurricular activity that
78	are not imposed on a fully enrolled public school student.
79	(c) (i) A private school student or \underline{a} home school student who participates in an
80	extracurricular activity at a public school shall pay the same fees as required of a fully enrolled
81	public school student to participate in an extracurricular activity.
82	(ii) If a local school board or \underline{a} charter school governing board imposes a mandatory
83	student activity fee for a student enrolled in a public school, the fee may be imposed on a
84	private school student or a home school student who participates in an extracurricular activity
85	at the public school if the same benefits of paying the mandatory student activity fee that are
86	available to a fully enrolled public school student are available to a private school student or a
87	home school student who participates in an extracurricular activity at the public school.
88	(4) Eligibility requirements based on school attendance are not applicable to a home
89	school student.

90	(5) A home school student meets academic eligibility requirements to participate in an
91	extracurricular activity if:
92	(a) the student is mastering the material in each course or subject being taught; and
93	(b) the student is maintaining satisfactory progress towards achievement or promotion.
94	(6) (a) To establish a home school student's academic eligibility, a parent, teacher, or
95	organization providing instruction to the student shall submit an affidavit to the principal
96	indicating the student meets academic eligibility requirements.
97	(b) Upon submission of an affidavit pursuant to Subsection (6)(a), a home school
98	student shall:
99	(i) be considered to meet academic eligibility requirements; and
100	(ii) retain academic eligibility for all extracurricular activities during the activity season
101	for which the affidavit is submitted, until:
102	(A) a panel established under Subsection (10) determines the home school student does
103	not meet academic eligibility requirements; or
104	(B) the person who submitted the affidavit under Subsection (6)(a) provides written
105	notice to the school principal that the student no longer meets academic eligibility
106	requirements.
107	(7) (a) A home school student who loses academic eligibility pursuant to Subsection
108	(6)(b)(ii)(B) may not participate in an extracurricular activity until the person who submitted
109	the affidavit under Subsection (6)(a) provides written notice to the school principal that the
110	home school student has reestablished academic eligibility.
111	(b) If a home school student reestablishes academic eligibility pursuant to Subsection
112	(7)(a), the home school student may participate in extracurricular activities for the remainder of
113	the activity season for which an affidavit was submitted under Subsection (6)(a).
114	(8) A person who has probable cause to believe a home school student does not meet
115	academic eligibility requirements may submit an affidavit to the principal:
116	(a) asserting the home school student does not meet academic eligibility requirements;
117	and
118	(b) providing information indicating that the home school student does not meet the
119	academic eligibility requirements.
120	(9) A principal shall review the affidavit submitted under Subsection (8), and if the

121	principal determines it contains information which constitutes probable cause to believe a
122	home school student may not meet academic eligibility requirements, the principal shall
123	request a panel established pursuant to Subsection (10) to verify the student's compliance with
124	academic eligibility requirements.
125	(10) (a) A school district superintendent shall:
126	(i) appoint a panel of three individuals to verify a home school student's compliance
127	with academic eligibility requirements when requested by a principal pursuant to Subsection
128	(9); and
129	(ii) select the panel members from nominees submitted by national, state, or regional
130	organizations whose members are home school students and parents.
131	(b) Of the members appointed to a panel under Subsection (10)(a):
132	(i) one member shall have experience teaching in a public school as a licensed teacher
133	and in home schooling high school-age students;
134	(ii) one member shall have experience teaching in a higher education institution and in
135	home schooling; and
136	(iii) one member shall have experience in home schooling high school-age students.
137	(11) A panel appointed under Subsection (10):
138	(a) shall review the affidavit submitted under Subsection (8);
139	(b) may confer with the person who submitted the affidavit under Subsection (8);
140	(c) shall request the home school student to submit test scores or a portfolio of work
141	documenting the student's academic achievement to the panel;
142	(d) shall review the test scores or portfolio of work; and
143	(e) shall determine whether the home school student meets academic eligibility
144	requirements.
145	(12) A home school student who meets academic eligibility requirements pursuant to
146	Subsection (11), retains academic eligibility for all extracurricular activities during the activity
147	season for which an affidavit is submitted pursuant to Subsection (6).
148	(13) (a) A panel's determination that a home school student does not comply with
149	academic eligibility requirements is effective for an activity season and all extracurricular
150	activities that have academic eligibility requirements.
151	(b) A home school student who is not in compliance with academic eligibility

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requirements as determined by a panel appointed under Subsection (11) may seek to establishacademic eligibility under this section for the next activity season.

(14) (a) A public school student who has been declared to be academically ineligible to
participate in an extracurricular activity and who subsequently enrolls in a home school shall
lose eligibility for participation in the extracurricular activity until the student:

(i) demonstrates academic eligibility by providing test results or a portfolio of the
student's work to the school principal, provided that a student may not reestablish academic
eligibility under this Subsection (14)(a) during the same activity season in which the student
was declared to be academically ineligible;

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(ii) returns to public school and reestablishes academic eligibility; or

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(iii) enrolls in a private school and establishes academic eligibility.

(b) A public school student who has been declared to be behaviorally ineligible to
participate in an extracurricular activity and who subsequently enrolls in a home school shall
lose eligibility for participation in the extracurricular activity until the student meets eligibility
standards as provided in Subsection (3).

167 (15) When selection to participate in an extracurricular activity at a public school is
168 made on a competitive basis, a private school student [and] or a home school student shall be
169 eligible to try out for and participate in the activity as provided in this section.

(16) (a) If a student exits a public school to enroll in a private <u>school</u> or <u>a</u> home school
mid-semester or during an activity season, and the student desires to participate in an
extracurricular activity at the public school, the public school shall issue an interim academic
assessment based on the student's work in each class.

(b) A student's academic eligibility to participate in an extracurricular activity under
the circumstances described in Subsection (16)(a) shall be based on the student meeting public
school academic eligibility standards at the time of exiting public school.

(c) A student may appeal an academic eligibility determination made under Subsection
(16)(b) in accordance with procedures for appealing a public school student's academic
eligibility.

183	(1) A charter school student is eligible to participate in an extracurricular activity not
184	offered by the student's charter school at:
185	(a) the school within whose attendance boundaries the student's custodial parent
186	resides;
187	(b) the public school from which the student withdrew for the purpose of attending a
188	charter school; or
189	(c) a public school that is not a charter school if the student's charter school is located
190	on the campus of the public school or has local school board approval to locate on the campus
191	of the public school.
192	(2) In addition to the public schools listed in Subsection (1), the state board may
193	establish rules to allow a charter school student to participate in an extracurricular activity at a
194	public school other than a public school listed in Subsection (1).
195	(3) A school other than a school described in Subsection (1)(a), (b), or (c) may allow a
196	charter school student to participate in [extracurricular activities other than:] an extracurricular
197	activity a public school sponsors and supports if:

202	(a) the charter school student receives permission to participate in the extracurricular

208	(4) A charter school student is eligible for <u>an</u> extracurricular [activities] activity at a
209	public school consistent with eligibility standards as applied to full-time students of the public

211	(5) A school district or <u>a</u> public school may not impose additional requirements on a
212	charter school student to participate in an extracurricular [activities] activity that are not
213	imposed on full-time students of the public school.

214	(6) (a) The state board shall make rules establishing fees for charter school students'
215	participation in <u>an</u> extracurricular [activities] activity at school district schools.
216	(b) The rules shall provide that:
217	(i) charter school students pay the same fees as other students to participate in an
218	extracurricular [activities] activity;
219	(ii) charter school students are eligible for fee waivers pursuant to Section 53G-7-504;
220	(iii) for each charter school student who participates in an extracurricular activity at a
221	school district school, the charter school shall pay a share of the school district's costs for the
222	extracurricular activity; and
223	(iv) a charter school's share of the costs of an extracurricular activity shall reflect state
224	and local tax revenues expended, except capital facilities expenditures, for an extracurricular
225	activity in a school district or \underline{a} school divided by total student enrollment of the school district
226	or <u>the</u> school.
227	(c) In determining a charter school's share of the costs of an extracurricular activity
228	under Subsections (6)(b)(iii) and (iv), the state board may establish uniform fees statewide
229	based on average costs statewide or average costs within a sample of school districts.
230	(7) When selection to participate in an extracurricular activity at a public school is
231	made on a competitive basis, a charter school student is eligible to try out for and participate in
232	the activity as provided in this section.

235	(1) As used in this section:
236	(a) "Online education" means the use of information and communication technologies
237	to deliver educational opportunities to a student in a location other than a school.
238	(b) "Online student" means a student who:
239	(i) participates in an online education program sponsored or supported by the state
240	board, a school district, or <u>a</u> charter school; and
241	(ii) generates funding for the school district or the school pursuant to Subsection
242	53F-2-102(4) and rules of the state board.
243	(2) An online student is eligible to participate in <u>an</u> extracurricular [activities] activity
244	at:

245	(a) the school [within whose] with attendance boundaries within which the student's
246	custodial parent resides; or
247	(b) the public school from which the student withdrew for the purpose of participating

249	(3) A <u>public</u> school other than a school described in Subsection (2)(a) or (b) may allow
