95	year, all institutions shall award credit to a student who receives an International Baccalaureate
96	programme subject score of four or higher for an International Baccalaureate programme
97	course unless the award of credit duplicates credit an institution already awarded.
98	(b) An institution, in collaboration with the Utah Association of IB World Schools and
99	school International Baccalaureate program coordinators, shall determine whether the credit
100	awarded in Subsection (5)(a) will satisfy electives, general education requirements, or major

102	(6) The board shall consult with the Utah Association of IB World Schools and school
103	International Baccalaureate program coordinators to develop policies for all institutions
