29	(1) As used in this section:
30	(a) "Advanced practice registered nurse" means a person licensed to practice as an
31	advanced practice registered nurse in this state under Title 58, Chapter 31b, Nurse Practice Act.
32	(b) "Nurse practitioner" means an advanced practice registered nurse specializing as a
33	nurse practitioner.
34	(c) "Physician" means a person licensed to practice as a physician or osteopath in this

95	placard, or removable windshield placard may be used to allow one motorcycle to share a
