	Section 1. Section 79-2-407 is enacted to read:			
	<u>79-2-407.</u> Utah Water Ways.			
	(1) As used in this section:			
	(a) "Partnership" means the nonprofit, statewide partnership described in Subsections			
	(2) and (3).			
	(b) "Water supply entity" means an entity supplying either culinary or irrigation water			
to a water user.				
	(2) The department shall oversee:			
	(a) the creation of a nonprofit, statewide partnership in accordance with this section;			
	and			
	(b) the state's participation in the partnership.			
	(3) The partnership shall:			
	(a) be known as "Utah Water Ways";			
	(b) have as core purposes to:			
	(i) facilitate coordination of efforts to efficiently use water by:			
	(A) sponsoring policy discussions about the state's water supply;			
	(B) engaging the private sector to help support efforts to efficiently use water and			
related activities;				
	(C) coordinating with the Department of Agriculture and Food and the Department of
