

Representative Calvin R. Musselman proposes the following substitute bill:

UTAH WATER WAYS

2023 GENERAL SESSION

LONG TITLE

General Description:

This bill provides for the creation of a new nonprofit, statewide partnership addressing water.

Highlighted Provisions:

This bill:

- ▶ defines terms;
- ▶ directs oversight of the creation of a partnership and the state's role in that partnership;
- ▶ outlines powers and duties of the partnership;
- ▶ addresses the selection of an executive director and board of directors; and
- ▶ addresses role of water supply entities.

Money Appropriated in this Bill:

This bill appropriates in fiscal year 2024:

- ▶ to the Department of Natural Resources - Water Resources, as a one-time appropriation:
 - from the General Fund, One-time, \$2,000,000; and
- ▶ to the Department of Natural Resources - Water Resources, as an ongoing appropriation:



26 • from the General Fund, \$1,000,000.

33 *Be it enacted by the Legislature of the state of Utah:*

34 Section 1. Section **79-2-407** is enacted to read:

35 **79-2-407. Utah Water Ways.**

36 (1) As used in this section:

37 (a) "Partnership" means the nonprofit, statewide partnership described in Subsections
38 (2) and (3).

39 (b) "Water supply entity" means an entity supplying either culinary or irrigation water
40 to a water user.

41 (2) The department shall oversee:

42 (a) the creation of a nonprofit, statewide partnership in accordance with this section;
43 and

44 (b) the state's participation in the partnership.

45 (3) The partnership shall:

46 (a) be known as "Utah Water Ways";

47 (b) have as core purposes to:

48 (i) facilitate coordination of efforts to optimize the use of water by:

49 (A) sponsoring policy discussions about the state's water supply;

50 (B) engaging the private sector to help support efforts to optimize the use of water and
51 related activities;

52 (C) coordinating with the Department of Agriculture and Food and the Department of
53 Environmental Quality on water related issues;

54 (D) maintaining communication among partners in the partnership;

55 (E) providing a line of communication from partners to state leaders; and

56 (F) promoting coordination of grants, rebate programs, or sponsorships that support the

57 optimal use of water; and
58 (ii) encourage residents of the state to make changes to optimize the use of water and
59 care for the state's water supply by:
60 (A) providing public education and public awareness campaigns and helping
61 consolidate campaigns about the state's water supply, water quality, and water use; and
62 (B) providing residents of the state with tools to understand what can be done to
63 optimize the use of water; and
64 (c) seek grants, gifts, donations, devises, and bequests.
65 (4) The board of directors for the partnership shall:
66 (a) consist of 12 individuals as follows:
67 (i) the executive director of the department, or the executive director's designee;
68 (ii) the director of the Division of Water Resources, or the director's designee;
69 (iii) the executive director of the Department of Environmental Quality, or the
70 executive director's designee;
71 (iv) the commissioner of the Department of Agriculture and Food, or the
72 commissioner's designee;
73 (v) the general managers for four water conservancy districts selected jointly by the
74 governor, the speaker of the House of Representatives, and the president of the Senate; and
75 (vi) four members of the business community selected jointly by the governor, the
76 speaker of the House of Representatives, and the president of the Senate;
77 (b) hire an executive director by August 1, 2023, who shall serve for an initial term of
78 four years; and
79 (c) adopt policies concerning the board of directors' internal organization and
80 procedures.
81 (5) The partnership may, consistent with this section, receive a grant, gift, donation,
82 devise, or bequest.
83 (6) Notwithstanding the creation of the partnership, a water supply entity may maintain
84 an important role with water supply users to encourage the optimized use of water such as
85 through localized messaging, rebate programs, or other activities.
86 **Section 2. Appropriations.**
87 The following sums of money are appropriated for the fiscal year beginning July 1,

88 2023, and ending June 30, 2024. These are additions to amounts previously appropriated for
89 fiscal year 2024. Under the terms and conditions of Title 63J, Chapter 1, Budgetary Procedures
90 Act, the Legislature appropriates the following sums of money from the funds or accounts
91 indicated for the use and support of the government of the state of Utah.

93 To Department of Natural Resources -- Water Resources

94 From General Fund 2,000,000

95 From General Fund, One-time 1,000,000

96 Schedule of Programs:

97 Planning 3,000,000

98 **Section 3. Effective date.**

99 This bill takes effect on July 1, 2023.
