 - -- {Medical Education Council} Clinical Services, as an ongoing appropriation:
 - from the Income Tax Fund, \$500,000.

26-69-409, Utah Code Annotated 1953

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the state of Utah:

Section 1. Section 26-69-409 is enacted to read:

26-69-409. Clinical healthcare experience grant.

- (1) As used in this section:
- (a) "Clinical healthcare experience" means {all}a supervised learning {experiences required and}experience included as part of a training course in which a healthcare student provides or observes direct patient care.
 - (b) "Healthcare provider" means the same as that term is defined in Section 78B-3-403.
- (c) "Healthcare student" means an individual who is enrolled at a private or public institution of higher education within the state in a program that {meets the educational requirements for licensure as:
 - (i) a physician and surgeon, as described in Section 58-67-302;
 - (ii) an osteopathic physician and surgeon, as described in Section 58-68-302;
 - (iii) an advanced practice registered nurse, as described in Section 58-31b-302;
 - (iv) a physician assistant, as described in Section 58-70a-302;
 - (v) a dentist, as described in Section 58-69-302; or
 - (vi) a pharmacist, as described in Section 58-17b-303.

requires a clinical healthcare experience.

- (2) (a) There is created within the department the Clinical Healthcare Experience Grant to be administered by UMEC.
- (b) UMEC shall establish a clinical healthcare experience grant program that will award grants to healthcare provider applicants to provide clinical healthcare experiences to healthcare students.
 - (3) An applicant that submits a proposal for a grant shall:
- (a) demonstrate how the applicant is qualified to provide a clinical healthcare experience, including:
- (i) a description of resources available for providing a clinical healthcare experience; and
- (ii) a description of resources or staff needed for providing a clinical healthcare training experience;
- (b) provide an estimate of how many healthcare students for whom the applicant can provide a clinical healthcare experience; and
- (c) provide any additional information related to the grant application UMEC deems necessary for awarding the grant.
- (4) Subject to appropriation by the Legislature, the amount of a grant is \$500 each month for each clinical healthcare experience provided to a healthcare student, with an annual maximum of \$2,000 per healthcare student.
- (5) Before November 1, 2024, and each November 1 thereafter, UMEC shall provide a written report to the Higher Education Appropriations Subcommittee describing:
 - (a) the health care providers that received a grant; and
 - (b) the number of clinical healthcare experiences funded by the grant.

Section 2. Appropriation.

The following sums of money are appropriated for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2023, and ending June 30, 2024. These are additions to amounts previously appropriated for fiscal year 2024. Under the terms and conditions of Title 63J, Chapter 1, Budgetary Procedures Act, the Legislature appropriates the following sums of money from the funds or accounts indicated for the use and support of the government of the state of Utah.
