40	or moped within the path or part of the roadway set aside for the exclusive use of a bicycle or
41	moped if a path or part of the roadway set aside for the exclusive use of a bicycle or moped

43	[(1)] (2) [A person] An individual operating a bicycle or a moped on a roadway at less
44	than the normal speed of traffic at the time and place and under the conditions then existing
45	shall ride as near as practicable to the right-hand edge of the roadway except when:
46	(a) overtaking and passing another bicycle or vehicle proceeding in the same direction;

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- [(2)] (3) [A person] An individual operating a bicycle or moped on a highway shall operate in the designated direction of traffic.
- [(3)] (4) (a) [A person] An individual riding a bicycle or moped on a roadway may not ride more than two abreast with another [person] individual except on paths or parts of roadways set aside for the exclusive use of bicycles.
- (b) If allowed under Subsection [(3)(a)] (4)(a), [a person] an individual riding two abreast with another [person] individual may not impede the normal and reasonable movement of traffic and shall ride within a single lane.
- [(4)] (5) If a usable path for bicycles has been provided adjacent to a roadway, a bicycle rider may be directed by a traffic-control device to use the path and not the roadway.
- [(5)] (6) (a) As used in this Subsection [(5)] (6), "immediate hazard" means a vehicle approaching an intersection at a proximity and rate of speed sufficient to indicate to a reasonable [person] individual that there is a danger of collision or accident.
- (b) Except as provided in Subsection [(6)] (7), an individual operating a bicycle approaching a stop sign may proceed through the intersection without stopping at the stop sign if:
 - (i) the individual slows to a reasonable speed; and
 - (ii) yields the right-of-way to:
 - (A) any pedestrian within the intersection or an adjacent crosswalk;
 - (B) other traffic within the intersection; and
- (C) oncoming traffic that poses an immediate hazard during the time the individual is traveling through the intersection.
