	(1) (a) As used in this section:
	[(a)] (i) "Airport authority" has the same meaning as defined in Section 72-10-102.



28	[(b)] (ii) "Dangerous weapon" is the same as defined in Section 76-10-501.
29	[(e)] (iii) "Explosive" is the same as defined for "explosive, chemical, or incendiary
