LONG TITLE

General Description:

This bill enacts a provision relating to the identification of a minor victim of homicide.

Highlighted Provisions:

This bill:

- ▶ prohibits a law enforcement agency and law enforcement officer from ~~publicly~~ disclosing to a media representative information on the identity of a minor victim of a criminal homicide without making a reasonable effort to obtain specified consent.

ENACTS:

53-22-101, Utah Code Annotated 1953

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the state of Utah:

Section 1. Section 53-22-101 is enacted to read:

CHAPTER 22. LAW ENFORCEMENT REQUIREMENTS

53-22-101. Prohibition on ~~public~~ disclosure of identity of minor homicide victim.

(1) As used in this section:

(a) "Criminal homicide" means the same as that term is defined in Section 76-5-201.

(b) "Minor victim" means the victim of a criminal homicide if the victim is younger than 18 years old.

(c) "Parent or legal guardian" does not include an individual who is a suspect or defendant with respect to the criminal homicide.

(2) A law enforcement agency and law enforcement officer may not ~~publicly~~ disclose to a media representative the name or other personally identifying information of a minor victim ~~without the express~~ until the law enforcement agency or law enforcement officer has made a reasonable effort to obtain the consent of the minor victim's parent or legal guardian for the disclosure.
