## 1st Sub. (Buff) H.B. 518

26	Be it enacted by the Legislature of the state of Utah:
27	Section 1. Section <b>53B-16-112</b> is enacted to read:
28	53B-16-112. Human trafficking educational program or series.
29	(1) Beginning July 1, 2023, an institution of higher education shall offer to each
30	student in the student's first year of study an educational program regarding the prevention of
31	human trafficking and exploitation.
32	(2) An institution of higher education shall:
33	(a) provide a course or program that specializes in outreach and educational
34	programming about human trafficking and exploitation;
35	(b) offer the course or program at least three times each year in a format chosen by the
36	institution of higher education; and
37	(c) ensure the course or program is taught by professionals with experience in
38	investigation, prosecution, and victim advocacy related to human trafficking.
39	(3) As part of the program, the course shall include:
40	(a) consistent with state law, the definitions of human trafficking, sex trafficking, and
41	labor trafficking;
42	(b) an explanation of the grooming cycle;
43	(c) examples of trafficker behavior;
44	(d) risk factors for becoming a victim of human trafficking;
45	(e) a demonstration showing that human trafficking can happen to any individual;
46	(f) steps to protect against becoming a victim of human trafficking; and
47	(g) how to prevent and report human trafficking.
