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#### LONG TITLE

##### General Description:

This bill creates a human trafficking educational program in an institution of higher education.

##### Highlighted Provisions:

This bill:

- ▶ directs each institution of higher education ~~{to contract with a non-profit organization}~~ or the Utah System of Higher Education to provide a human trafficking educational program to first year students;
- ▶ requires the program be taught by individuals with certain expertise; and
- ▶ describes the required components ~~{of the program; and~~  
~~requires the institution of higher education to pay the cost}~~ of the program.

ENACTS:

**53B-16-112**, Utah Code Annotated 1953

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*Be it enacted by the Legislature of the state of Utah:*

Section 1. Section **53B-16-112** is enacted to read:

**53B-16-112. Human trafficking educational program~~{or series}~~.**

(1) Beginning July 1, 2023, an institution of higher education or the Utah System of Higher Education shall offer to each student in the student's first year of study an educational program regarding the prevention of human trafficking and exploitation.

(2) An institution of higher education ~~{shall:~~

~~— (a) contract with a non-profit organization that specializes}~~ or the Utah System of Higher Education shall ensure the program:

(a) is taught by one or more professionals who:

(i) have experience in investigation, prosecution, and victim advocacy related to human trafficking and exploitation; and

(ii) specialize in outreach and educational programming about human trafficking and exploitation~~{ to provide the program;~~

~~— (b) offer the program at least three times each year; and~~

~~— (c) pay the cost of the program, including any required materials.~~

~~— (3) As part of the program, the contracted non-profit organization shall include:~~

~~— (a); and~~

(b) includes the following components:

(i) consistent with state law, the definitions of human trafficking, sex trafficking, and labor trafficking;

(~~f~~b)ii) an explanation of the grooming cycle;

(~~f~~c)iii) examples of trafficker behavior;

(~~f~~d)iv) risk factors for becoming a victim of human trafficking;

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~~(fe)~~v a demonstration showing that human trafficking can happen to any individual;

~~(ff)~~vi steps to protect against becoming a victim of human trafficking; and

~~(fg)~~vii how to prevent and report human trafficking.

(3) An institution of higher education shall offer the program at least three times each year in a format chosen by the institution of higher education including:

(a) in-person; or

(b) a virtual pre-recording.

(4) An institution of higher education or the Utah System of Higher Education may satisfy the requirements of this section by offering a program created by a law enforcement organization or an organization of prosecutors including:

(a) a task force created by the Attorney General related to human trafficking and exploitation; or

(b) the Office of the Attorney General.
