LONG TITLE
General Description:
This bill supplements or reduces appropriations otherwise provided for the support and
operation of state government for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2023 and ending June 30, 2024.
Highlighted Provisions:
This bill:
 provides budget increases and decreases for the use and support of certain state agencies;
 provides budget increases and decreases for the use and support of certain institutions of
higher education;
 provides budget increases and decreases for other purposes as described;
 authorizes full time employment levels for certain internal service funds; and
 provides intent language.
Money Appropriated in this Bill:
This bill appropriates \$2,293,220,400 in operating and capital budgets for fiscal year 2024,
including:
 (\$372,794,000) from the General Fund;
 \$906,043,600 from the Income Tax Fund; and
 \$1,759,970,800 from various sources as detailed in this bill.
