operation of state government for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2023 and ending June 30, 2024.
Highlighted Provisions:
This bill:
 provides budget increases and decreases for the use and support of certain state agencies
and institutions of higher education;
authorizes certain state agency fees;
authorizes internal service fund rates;
 adjusts funding for the impact of Internal Service Fund rate changes; and,
 provides budget increases and decreases for other purposes as described.
Money Appropriated in this Bill:
This bill appropriates \$22,055,700 in operating and capital budgets for fiscal year 2024,
including:
► \$10,012,500 from the General Fund;
► \$2,308,100 from the Income Tax Fund; and
► \$9,735,100 from various sources as detailed in this bill.
This bill appropriates \$133,400 in expendable funds and accounts for fiscal year 2024,
including:
► \$18,300 from the General Fund; and
► \$115,100 from various sources as detailed in this bill.
This bill appropriates \$27,200 in business-like activities for fiscal year 2024.
This bill appropriates \$3,200 in restricted fund and account transfers for fiscal year 2024, all
of which is from the General Fund.
This bill appropriates \$12,400 in fiduciary funds for fiscal year 2024.
