8	General Description:
9	This bill modifies provisions related to a board, committee, or council created under
10	Title 23, Wildlife Resources Code of Utah.

13	 makes consistent the number of names the nominating committee submits to the
14	governor;
15	 removes incorrect references to boards;
16	 clarifies orientation training language related to regional advisory councils;
17	 extends sunset dates; and
18	 makes technical changes.

	Section 1. Section 23-14-2 is amended to read:
	23-14-2. Wildlife Board Creation Membership Terms Quorum
	Meetings Per diem and expenses.
	(1) There is created a Wildlife Board which shall consist of seven members appointed
)	by the governor with the advice and consent of the Senate in accordance with Title 63G,
7	Chapter 24, Part 2, Vacancies.
8	(2) (a) In addition to the requirements of Section 79-2-203, the members of the board
)	shall have expertise or experience in at least one of the following areas:
)	(i) wildlife management or biology;
	(ii) habitat management, including range or aquatic;
)	(iii) business, including knowledge of private land issues; and
,	(iv) economics, including knowledge of recreational wildlife uses.
ļ	(b) Each of the areas of expertise under Subsection (2)(a) shall be represented by at
5	least one member of the Wildlife Board.
)	(3) (a) The governor shall select each board member from a list of nominees submitted
7	by the nominating committee pursuant to Section 23-14-2.5.
3	(b) No more than two members shall be from a single wildlife region described in
)	Subsection 23-14-2.6(1).
)	(c) The governor may request an additional list of at least two nominees from the
	nominating committee if the initial list of nominees for a given position is unacceptable.
)	(d) (i) If the governor fails to appoint a board member within 60 days after receipt of
,	the initial or additional list, the nominating committee shall make an interim appointment by
ŀ	majority vote.
5	(ii) The interim board member shall serve until the matter is resolved by the committee
)	and the governor or until the board member is replaced pursuant to this chapter.
7	(4) (a) Except as required by Subsection (4)(b), as terms of current board members

58	expire, the governor shall appoint each new member or reappointed member to a six-year term.
59	(b) Notwithstanding the requirements of Subsection (4)(a), the governor shall, at the
60	time of appointment or reappointment, adjust the length of terms to ensure that:
61	(i) the terms of board members are staggered so that approximately one-third of the
62	board is appointed every two years; and
63	(ii) members serving from the same region have staggered terms.
64	(c) If a vacancy occurs, the nominating committee shall submit <u>at least</u> two names, as
65	provided in Subsection 23-14-2.5(4), to the governor and the governor shall appoint a
66	replacement for the unexpired term.
67	(d) Board members may serve only one term unless:
68	(i) the member is among the first board members appointed to serve four years or less;
69	or
70	(ii) the member filled a vacancy under Subsection (4)(c) for four years or less.
71	(5) (a) The board shall elect a chair and a vice chair from its membership.
72	(b) Four members of the board shall constitute a quorum.
73	(c) The director of the Division of Wildlife Resources shall act as secretary to the
74	board but is not a voting member of the board.
75	(6) (a) The Wildlife Board shall hold a sufficient number of public meetings each year
76	to expeditiously conduct its business.
77	(b) Meetings may be called by the chair upon five days notice or upon shorter notice in
78	emergency situations.
79	(c) Meetings may be held at the Salt Lake City office of the Division of Wildlife
80	Resources or elsewhere as determined by the Wildlife Board.
81	(7) A member may not receive compensation or benefits for the member's service, but
82	may receive per diem and travel expenses in accordance with:
83	(a) Section 63A-3-106;
84	(b) Section $63A-3-107$; and
85	(c) rules made by the Division of Finance pursuant to Sections $63A-3-106$ and

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86	63A-3-107.
87	(8) (a) The members of the Wildlife Board shall complete an orientation course to
88	assist them in the performance of the duties of their office.
89	(b) The Department of Natural Resources shall provide the course required under
90	Subsection (8)(a).
91	(9) A member shall comply with the conflict of interest provisions described in Title
92	63G, Chapter 24, Part 3, Conflicts of Interest.
93	Section 2. Section 23-14-2.5 is amended to read:
94	23-14-2.5. Wildlife Board Nominating Committee Creation Membership
95	Terms Quorum.
96	(1) There is created a Wildlife Board Nominating Committee which shall consist of 11
97	members.
98	(2) The governor shall appoint members to the nominating committee as follows:
99	(a) three members shall be appointed from a list of at least two nominees per position
100	submitted by the agriculture industry;
101	(b) three members shall be appointed from a list of at least two nominees per position
102	submitted by sportsmen groups;
103	(c) two members shall be appointed from a list of at least two nominees per position
104	submitted by nonconsumptive wildlife interests;
105	(d) one member shall be appointed from a list of at least two nominees submitted by
106	federal land management agencies;
107	(e) one local elected official shall be appointed from a list of at least two nominees
108	submitted by the Utah Association of Counties; and
109	(f) one range management specialist shall be appointed from a list of at least two
110	nominees submitted jointly by the Utah Chapter, Society of Range Management and the Utah
111	Chapter, <u>The</u> Wildlife Society.
112	(3) Each wildlife region described in Subsection $23-14-2.6(1)$ shall be represented by at
113	least one member and no wildlife region may be represented by more than three members.

114	(4) The nominating committee shall nominate at least two, but not more than four,
115	candidates for each position or vacancy which occurs on the board.
116	(5) (a) Except as required by Subsection (5)(b), as terms of current [board] members
117	expire, the governor shall appoint each new or reappointed member to a four-year term.
118	(b) Notwithstanding the requirements of Subsection (5)(a), the governor shall, at the
119	time of appointment or reappointment, adjust the length of terms to ensure that:
120	(i) the terms of [board] members are staggered so that approximately half of the
121	[board] nominating committee is appointed every two years; and
122	(ii) members from the same wildlife region serve staggered terms.
123	(c) If a vacancy occurs for any reason, the governor shall appoint a replacement in the
124	same manner that the position was originally filled to serve the remainder of the unexpired
125	term.
126	(6) The nominating committee shall select a chair and vice chair from its membership.
127	(7) Six members shall constitute a quorum.

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142	(3) The executive director of the Department of Natural Resources, in consultation
143	with the director of the Division of Wildlife Resources, shall select the members from a list of
144	nominees submitted by the respective interest group or agency.
145	(4) The councils shall:
146	(a) hear broad input, including recommendations, biological data, and information
147	regarding the effects of wildlife;
148	(b) gather information from staff, the public, and government agencies; and
149	(c) make recommendations to the Wildlife Board in an advisory capacity.
150	(5) (a) Except as required by Subsection (5)(b), each member shall serve a four-year
151	term.
152	(b) Notwithstanding the requirements of Subsection (5)(a), the executive director shall,
153	at the time of appointment or reappointment, adjust the length of terms to ensure that the terms
154	of council members are staggered so that approximately half of the council is appointed every
155	two years.
156	(6) When a vacancy occurs in the membership for any reason, the replacement shall be
157	appointed for the unexpired term.
158	(7) The councils shall determine:
159	(a) the time and place of meetings; and
160	(b) any other procedural matter not specified in this chapter.
161	(8) Members of the councils shall complete an orientation course [as provided]
162	described in Subsection 23-14-2(8).
163	(9) A member may not receive compensation or benefits for the member's service, but
164	may receive per diem and travel expenses in accordance with:
165	(a) Section 63A-3-106;
166	(b) Section $63A-3-107$; and
167	(c) rules made by the Division of Finance pursuant to Sections 63A-3-106 and
168	63A-3-107.
