LONG TITLE

General Description:

This bill amends provisions related to motor vehicle registration and license plates.

Highlighted Provisions:

This bill:

- ▶ clarifies when the State Tax Commission may impose a registration reinstatement fee;
- ▶ creates the License Plate Restricted Account (restricted account);
- ▶ repeals the honorary consulate special group license plate;
- ▶ provides that appropriations from the restricted account are nonlapsing; and
- ▶ makes technical changes.

43 Section 1. Section **26-54-102** is amended to read:

44 **26-54-102. Spinal Cord and Brain Injury Rehabilitation Fund -- Creation --**
45 **Administration -- Uses.**

46 (1) As used in this section, a "qualified IRC 501(c)(3) charitable clinic" means a
47 professional medical clinic that:

48 (a) provides rehabilitation services to individuals in the state:

49 (i) who have a traumatic spinal cord or brain injury that tends to be nonprogressive or
50 nondeteriorating; and

51 (ii) who require post-acute care;

52 (b) employs licensed therapy clinicians;

53 (c) has at least five years experience operating a post-acute care rehabilitation clinic in
54 the state; and

55 (d) has obtained tax-exempt status under Internal Revenue Code, 26 U.S.C. Sec.
56 501(c)(3).

57 (2) There is created an expendable special revenue fund known as the "Spinal Cord and

58 Brain Injury Rehabilitation Fund."

59 (3) The fund shall consist of:

60 (a) gifts, grants, donations, or any other conveyance of money that may be made to the
61 fund from private sources;

62 (b) a portion of the impound fee as designated in Section [41-6a-1406](#);

63 (c) the fees collected by the Motor Vehicle Division under Subsections
64 [~~41-1a-1201(9)~~] [41-1a-1201\(8\)](#) and [41-22-8\(3\)](#); and

65 (d) amounts appropriated by the Legislature.

66 (4) The fund shall be administered by the executive director of the department, in

76 Section 2. Section **41-1a-110** is amended to read:

77 **41-1a-110. Authority of division to suspend or revoke registration, certificate of**
78 **title, license plate, or permit.**

79 (1) Except as provided in Subsections (3) and (4), the division may suspend or revoke
80 a registration, certificate of title, license plate, or permit if:

81 (a) the division is satisfied that a registration, certificate of title, license plate, or permit
82 was fraudulently procured or erroneously issued;

83 (b) the division determines that a registered vehicle is mechanically unfit or unsafe to
84 be operated or moved upon the highways;

85 (c) a registered vehicle has been dismantled;

86 (d) the division determines that the required fee has not been paid and the fee is not
87 paid upon reasonable notice and demand;

88 (e) a registration decal, license plate, or permit is knowingly displayed upon a vehicle
89 other than the one for which issued;

90 (f) the division determines that the owner has committed any offense under this chapter
91 involving the registration, certificate of title, registration card, license plate, registration decal,
92 or permit; or

93 (g) the division receives notification by the Department of Transportation that the
94 owner has committed any offence under Title 72, Chapter 9, Motor Carrier Safety Act.

95 (2) (a) The division shall revoke the registration of a vehicle if the division receives
96 notification by the:

97 (i) Department of Public Safety that a person:

98 (A) has been convicted of operating a registered motor vehicle in violation of Section
99 [41-12a-301](#) or [41-12a-303.2](#); or

100 (B) is under an administrative action taken by the Department of Public Safety for
101 operating a registered motor vehicle in violation of Section [41-12a-301](#); or

102 (ii) designated agent that the owner of a motor vehicle:

103 (A) has failed to provide satisfactory proof of owner's or operator's security to the
104 designated agent after the second notice provided under Section [41-12a-804](#); or

105 (B) provided a false or fraudulent statement to the designated agent.

106 (b) The division shall notify the Driver License Division if the division revokes the
107 registration of a vehicle under Subsection (2)(a)(ii)(A).

108 (3) The division may not suspend or revoke the registration of a vessel or outboard
109 motor unless authorized under Section [73-18-7.3](#).

110 (4) The division may not suspend or revoke the registration of an off-highway vehicle
111 unless authorized under Section [41-22-17](#).

112 (5) The division shall charge a registration reinstatement fee under Section [41-1a-1220](#),
113 if the registration is revoked under Subsection [~~(1)~~](2).

114 (6) Except as provided in Subsections (3), (4), and (7), the division may suspend or
115 revoke a registered vehicle's registration if the division is notified by a local health department,
116 as defined in Section [26A-1-102](#), that the registered vehicle is unable to meet state or local air
117 emissions standards or violates Subsection [41-6a-1626\(2\)\(a\)](#) or (b).

118 (7) The division may not suspend or revoke a registered vehicle's registration under
119 Subsection (6) if the registered vehicle has a manufacturer's gross vehicle weight rating that is
120 greater than 26,000 pounds.

121 Section 3. Section **41-1a-122** is enacted to read:

122 **41-1a-122. License Plate Restricted Account.**

123 (1) As used in this section, "account" means the License Plate Restricted Account
124 created in Subsection (2).

125 (2) There is created within the General Fund a restricted account known as the
126 "License Plate Restricted Account."

127 (3) The account consists of money deposited into the account in accordance with
128 Subsection [41-1a-1201\(3\)](#).

129 (4) The Legislature shall appropriate funds in the account to the commission for the
130 costs of issuing license plates and decals.

131 (5) In accordance with Section [63J-1-602.1](#), appropriations made to the division from
132 the account are nonlapsing.

135 (1) The division shall only issue special group license plates in accordance with this
136 section through Section [41-1a-422](#) to a person who is specified under this section within the
137 categories listed as follows:

139 (b) honor special group license plates, as in a war hero, which plates are issued for a:

140 (i) survivor of the Japanese attack on Pearl Harbor;

141 (ii) former prisoner of war;

- 142 (iii) recipient of a Purple Heart;
- 143 (iv) disabled veteran;
- 144 (v) recipient of a gold star award issued by the United States Secretary of Defense; or
- 145 (vi) recipient of a campaign or combat theater award determined by the Department of
- 146 Veterans and Military Affairs;
- 147 (c) unique vehicle type special group license plates, as for historical, collectors value,
- 148 or other unique vehicle type, which plates are issued for:
 - 149 (i) a special interest vehicle;
 - 150 (ii) a vintage vehicle;

 - 152 (iv) (A) until Subsection (1)(c)(iv)(B) or (4) applies, a vehicle powered by clean fuel as

188 (xi) programs that provide support to organizations that create affordable housing for
189 those in severe need through the Division of Real Estate;

191 (xiii) programs that support Zion National Park;

192 (xiv) beginning on July 1, 2009, programs that provide support to firefighter
193 organizations;

194 (xv) programs that promote bicycle operation and safety awareness;

195 (xvi) programs that conduct or support cancer research;

196 (xvii) programs that create or support autism awareness;

197 (xviii) programs that create or support humanitarian service and educational and

198 cultural exchanges;

199 (xix) until September 30, 2017, programs that conduct or support prostate cancer

224 (2) (a) The division may not issue a new type of special group license plate or decal
225 unless the division receives:

226 (i) (A) a private donation for the start-up fee established under Section 63J-1-504 for
227 the production and administrative costs of providing the new special group license plates or
228 decals; or

229 (B) a legislative appropriation for the start-up fee provided under Subsection
230 (2)(a)(i)(A); and

231 (ii) beginning on January 1, 2012, and for the issuance of a support special group
232 license plate authorized in Section 41-1a-422, at least 500 completed applications for the new
233 type of support special group license plate or decal to be issued with all fees required under this
234 part for the support special group license plate or decal issuance paid by each applicant.

235 (b) (i) Beginning on January 1, 2012, each participating organization shall collect and
236 hold applications for support special group license plates or decals authorized in Section
237 41-1a-422 on or after January 1, 2012, until it has received at least 500 applications.

238 (ii) Once a participating organization has received at least 500 applications, it shall
239 submit the applications, along with the necessary fees, to the division for the division to begin
240 working on the design and issuance of the new type of support special group license plate or
241 decal to be issued.

243 of a new support special group license plate or decal authorized in Section 41-1a-422 until the

249 registration of a motor vehicle that has been issued a firefighter recognition special group
250 license plate unless the applicant is a contributor as defined in Subsection
251 41-1a-422(1)(a)(ii)(D) to the Firefighter Support Restricted Account.

252 (ii) A registered owner of a vehicle that has been issued a firefighter recognition
253 special group license plate prior to July 1, 2009, upon renewal of the owner's motor vehicle

254 registration shall:

255 (A) be a contributor to the Firefighter Support Restricted Account as required under
256 Subsection (2)(c)(i); or

257 (B) replace the firefighter recognition special group license plate with a new license
258 plate.

259 (3) Beginning on July 1, 2011, if a support special group license plate or decal type
260 authorized in Section 41-1a-422 and issued on or after January 1, 2012, has fewer than 500
261 license plates issued each year for a three consecutive year time period that begins on July 1,

263 applicant beginning on January 1 of the following calendar year after the three consecutive year

269 support special group license plate.

270 (b) A registered owner of a vehicle that has been issued a prostate cancer support
271 special group license plate before October 1, 2017, may renew the owner's motor vehicle
272 registration, with the contribution allocated as described in Section 41-1a-422.
