	(1) There is created within the division the position of medical director.



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28	(2) The position of medical director is a half full-time equivalent position.
29	(3) The medical director shall:
30	(a) be licensed to practice as a physician or osteopath under Title 58, Chapter 67, Utah
31	Medical Practice Act, or Title 58, Chapter 68, Utah Osteopathic Medical Practice Act;
32	(b) be board certified in pediatrics or family medicine; and
33	(c) have at least seven years of experience in direct patient care, or equivalent
34	experience.
35	(4) The medical director shall:
36	(a) serve as the chief medical advisor to the director;
37	(b) provide clinical expertise to division staff; and
38	(c) participate in the development, implementation, and evaluation of programs to
