9	Section 1. Section 53B-31-301 is amended to read:

2	(1) As used in this section:
3	(a) "Care" means the status of being legally subject to the control of another person or a
4	public agency.
5	(b) "Home detention" means the same as that term is defined in Section 80-1-102.
)	[(a)] (c) "Interactive video conferencing" means two-way, real-time transmission of
7	audio and video signals between devices or computers at two or more locations.
3	[(b)] (d) "Program" means the Utah Tech University Higher Education for Incarcerated
)	Youth Program.
)	(e) "Secure detention" means the same as that term is defined in Section 80-1-102.
	[(c)] (f) "Student" means an individual who is:
	(i) [in the custody of the Division of Juvenile Justice Services within the timeframe of
	the course being offered; and]
	(A) in the custody of the Division of Juvenile Justice Services within the timeframe of
	the course being offered; and

	(2) Consistent with policies established by the board, Utah Tech University shall,
	subject to legislative appropriation, establish and administer the Utah Tech University Higher
	Education for Incarcerated Youth Program to provide:
	(a) students needing high school credits opportunities for concurrent enrollment
	courses;
	(b) a consistent, two-year, flexible schedule of higher education courses delivered

67	certain state agencies Establishment of coordinating council Advisory councils.
68	(1) (a) The state board is directly responsible for the education of all individuals who
69	are:
70	(i) (A) younger than 21 years old; or
71	(B) eligible for special education services as described in Chapter 7, Part 2, Special
72	Education Program; and
73	(ii) (A) receiving services from the Department of Human Services;
74	(B) in the custody of an equivalent agency of a Native American tribe recognized by
75	the United States Bureau of Indian Affairs and whose custodial parent resides within the state;
76	or
77	(C) being held in a juvenile detention facility.
78	(b) The state board shall:
79	(i) make rules in accordance with Title 63G, Chapter 3, Utah Administrative
80	Rulemaking Act, to provide for the distribution of funds for the education of individuals
81	described in Subsection (1)(a); and
82	(ii) expend funds appropriated for the education of youth in [custody] care in the
83	following order of priority:
84	(A) for students in a facility described in Subsection (1)(a)(ii) who are not included in
85	an LEA's average daily membership; and

87	LEA's average daily membership and who may benefit from additional educational support

89	(c) Subject to future budget constraints, the amount appropriated for the education of
90	youth in [custody] care under this section shall increase annually based on the following:
91	(i) the percentage of enrollment growth of students in kindergarten through grade 12;
92	and
93	(ii) changes to the value of the weighted pupil unit as defined in Section 53F-4-301.
94	(2) Subsection $(1)(a)(ii)(B)$ does not apply to an individual taken into [custody] care for
95	the primary purpose of obtaining access to education programs provided for youth in custody.
96	(3) The state board shall, where feasible, contract with school districts or other
97	appropriate agencies to provide educational, administrative, and supportive services, but the
98	state board shall retain responsibility for the programs.
99	(4) The Legislature shall establish and maintain separate education budget categories
100	for youth in [custody] care or who are under the jurisdiction of [the following state agencies]:
101	(a) detention centers [and];
102	(b) the [Divisions] Division of Juvenile Justice Services [and];
103	(c) the Division of Child and Family Services;
104	[(b)] (d) the Division of Substance Abuse and Mental Health; [and]
105	[(c)] (e) the Division of Services for People with Disabilities[;]; and
106	(f) the Youth Parole Authority.
107	(5) (a) The Department of Human Services and the state board shall appoint a
108	coordinating council to plan, coordinate, and recommend budget, policy, and program

120	(1) "Career and technical education course" means a concurrent enrollment course in
121	career and technical education, as determined by the policy established by the Utah Board of
122	Higher Education under Section 53E-10-302.
123	(2) "Concurrent enrollment" means enrollment in a course offered through the
124	concurrent enrollment program described in Section 53E-10-302.
125	(3) "Educator" means the same as that term is defined in Section $53E-6-102$.
126	(4) "Eligible instructor" means an instructor who meets the requirements described in
127	Subsection 53E-10-302(6).
128	(5) "Eligible student" means a student who is:
129	(a) (i) [is] enrolled in, and counted in average daily membership in, a public school
130	within the state; or
131	(ii) [is] in the custody of the Division of Juvenile Justice Services; and
132	(iii) subject to the jurisdiction of the Youth Parole Authority;
133	(b) (i) placed in home detention; or
134	(ii) held in secure detention;

141	[(7)] (8) "License" means the same as that term is defined in Section 53E-6-102.
142	[(8)] (9) "Local education agency" or "LEA" means a school district or charter school.
143	[(9)] (10) "Qualifying experience" means an LEA employee's experience in an
144	academic field that:
145	(a) qualifies the LEA employee to teach a concurrent enrollment course in the
146	academic field; and
147	(b) may include the LEA employee's:
148	(i) number of years teaching in the academic field;
149	(ii) [holding a] higher level secondary teaching credential issued by the state board;

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150	(iii) research, publications, or other scholarly work in the academic field;
151	(iv) continuing professional education in the academic field;
152	(v) portfolio of work related to the academic field; or
153	(vi) professional work experience or certifications in the academic field.
154	(11) "Secure detention" means the same as that term is defined in Section $80-1-102$.
155	[(10)] (12) "Value of the weighted pupil unit" means the amount established each year
156	in the enacted public education budget that is multiplied by the number of weighted pupil units
157	to yield the funding level for the basic state-supported school program.
158	Section 4. Coordinating S.B. 145 with S.B. 47 Substantive and technical
159	amendments.
160	If this S.B. 145 and S.B. 47, Incarcerated Youth Education Amendments, both pass and
161	become law, the Legislature intends that the Office of Legislative Research and General
162	Counsel prepare the Utah Code database for publication by amending Subsection
163	<u>53B-31-301(1)(f) to read:</u>
164	"[(e)] (<u>f)</u> "Student" means an individual who is:
165	(i) subject to the jurisdiction of the Youth Parole Authority and in the custody of the
166	Division of Juvenile Justive and Youth Services [within the timeframe of the course] at any
167	time a course is being offered[; and], including:
168	(A) individuals in the legal custody of the Division of Juvenile Justive and Youth
169	Services; and
170	(B) individuals who are housed in a detention center that the Division of Juvenile
171	Justive and Youth Services operates;
172	[(ii) subject to the jurisdiction of the Youth Parole Authority.]

174	(iii) held in secure detention.
