	Section 1. Section 58-69-102 is amended to read:
	58-69-102. Definitions.
	In addition to the definitions in Section 58-1-102, as used in this chapter:
	[(1) "Asynchronous technology" means store-and-forward technology that allows a
}	licensed dental professional to transmit a patient's health information to a dentist for viewing at
;	a later time.]
	[(2)] (1) "Board" means the Dentist and Dental Hygienist Licensing Board created in
,	Section 58-69-201.
	[(3)] (2) "Dental assistant" means an [unlicensed] individual who [engages in, directly
,	or indirectly, supervised acts and duties as defined by division rule] is not licensed under this
<u>(</u>	chapter and acts:
	(a) under at least general supervision of a supervising dentist; and
	(b) in accordance with rules made by the division in collaboration with the board.
	[(4) "Direct supervision" means the supervising dentist is present and available for
İ	face-to-face communication with the person being supervised when and where professional
1	services are being provided.]
	[(5)] (3) "General supervision" means [that the] supervision by a supervising dentist
1	who is available [for consultation] to communicate with the individual being supervised
1	regarding work the supervising dentist has authorized the individual to perform, [without
1	regard as to whether] regardless of where the supervising dentist is located [on the same
1	premises as the person being supervised].
	[(6)] (4) "Indirect supervision" means [that the] supervision by a supervising dentist
1	<u>who</u> is <u>:</u>
	(a) physically present within the same facility [in which the person] as the individual
1	being supervised [is providing services and is]; and
	(b) immediately available to [provide immediate] to communicate face-to-face
	[communication] and in person with the [person] individual being supervised.

61	[(7)] <u>(6)</u> "Practice of dental hygiene" means, [regarding] with respect to humans and
62	subject to Section 58-69-801:
63	[(a) under the general supervision of a dentist, or under a written agreement with a
64	dentist licensed under this chapter, as provided in Section 58-69-801, to:]
65	[(i)] (a) [perform] performing a preliminary clinical examination of [human] teeth and
66	gums;
67	[(ii)] (b) [make] making preliminary instrumental examination of [patients'] a patient's
68	teeth;
69	[(iii)] (c) [expose] exposing dental radiographs;
70	[(iv)] (d) [assess] assessing dental hygiene status [and collaborate];
71	(e) collaborating with [the] a supervising dentist regarding a dental hygiene treatment
72	plan for a patient;
73	[(v)] (f) [remove] removing deposits, accumulations, calculus, and concretions from
74	the surfaces of [human] teeth;
75	[(vi)] (g) [remove] removing toxins and debris from subgingival surfaces;
76	[(vii)] (h) [provide] providing dental hygiene care in accordance with a dentist's
77	treatment plan for a patient;
78	[(viii)] (i) [take] taking impressions of teeth or jaws except for impressions or
79	registrations to supply artificial teeth as substitutes for natural teeth; [or]
80	[(ix) engage in other practices of dental hygiene as defined by division rule;]
81	(j) gathering diagnostic information from a patient in person for use by a dentist at a
82	remote location who is engaging in teledentistry with the patient, including information the
83	dentist may use:
84	(i) to form a tentative basic treatment plan for the patient; and
85	(ii) as the basis for issuing a prescription for appropriate preventive or urgent care;
86	(k) providing oral health education;
87	(1) performing any of the following, as defined by division rule:
88	(i) palliative dental care;
89	(ii) interim dental care; and

90	(iii) dental care to arrest dental caries, including:
91	(A) application of silver diamond fluoride; and
92	(B) use of glass ionomer cement in conjunction with silver diamond fluoride when
93	performing the Silver Modified Atraumatic Restorative Technique;
94	[(b)] (m) [under the indirect supervision of a dentist to administer] administering in
95	accordance with standards and ethics of the professions of dentistry and dental hygiene:
96	(i) <u>a</u> local [anesthesia] <u>anesthetic</u> ; or
97	(ii) nitrous oxide [analgesia];
98	[(c)] (n) [to represent] representing oneself by any title, degree, or in any other way as
99	being a dental hygienist; [or]
100	[(d)] (o) [to direct] directing a dental assistant when the supervising dentist is not on
101	the premises; or
102	(p) engaging in other practices of dental hygiene as defined by division rule.
103	[(8)] (7) "Practice of dentistry" means the following, regarding humans:
104	(a) to offer, undertake, or represent that a person will undertake by any means or
105	method[, including teledentistry,] to:
106	(i) examine, evaluate, diagnose, treat, operate, or prescribe therapy for any disease,
107	pain, injury, deficiency, deformity, or any other condition of the human teeth, alveolar process,
108	gums, jaws, or adjacent hard and soft tissues and structures in the maxillofacial region;
109	(ii) take an appropriate history and physical consistent with the level of professional
110	service to be provided and the available resources in the facility in which the service is to be
111	provided;
112	(iii) take impressions or registrations;
113	(iv) supply artificial teeth as substitutes for natural teeth;
114	(v) remove deposits, accumulations, calculus, and concretions from the surfaces of
115	teeth; and
116	(vi) correct or attempt to correct malposition of teeth;
117	(b) to administer anesthetics necessary or proper in the practice of dentistry only as
118	allowed by an [anesthesia] anesthetics permit obtained from the division;
119	(c) to administer and prescribe drugs related to and appropriate in the practice of
120	dentistry;

121	(d) to supervise the practice of a:
122	(i) dental hygienist in accordance with Subsection 58-69-801(1)(b); or
123	(ii) dental assistant as established by division rule made in collaboration with the
124	board; or
125	(e) to represent oneself by any title, degree, or in any other way that one is a dentist.
126	[(9)] <u>(8)</u> "Public health setting" means:
127	(a) an individual's residence, if the individual is unable to leave the residence;
128	(b) a school, as part of a school-based program;
129	(c) a nursing home;
130	(d) an assisted living or long-term care facility;
131	(e) a community health center;
132	(f) a federally-qualified health center; [or]
133	(g) a health care facility operated by a local health department or the Department of
134	Health and Human Services; or
135	$\left[\frac{(g)}{(h)}\right]$ a mobile dental health program that employs a dentist who is licensed under
136	this chapter.
137	[(10)] (9) "Supervising dentist" means a licensed dentist who has agreed to provide
138	general or indirect supervision of a dental hygienist or [unlicensed individual in accordance
139	with the provisions of this chapter] dental assistant.
140	[(11) "Synchronous technology" means two-way audiovisual technology that allows a
141	licensed dental professional to see and communicate in real time with a patient who is located
142	in a different physical location.]
143	[(12) "Teledentistry" means the practice of dentistry using synchronous or
144	asynchronous technology.]
145	$[\frac{(13)}{(10)}]$ "Unlawful conduct" means the same as that term is defined in Sections
146	58-1-501 and 58-69-501.
147	$[\frac{(14)}{(11)}]$ "Unprofessional conduct" means the same as that term is defined in
148	Sections 58-1-501 and 58-69-502 and as may be further defined by rule.
149	Section 2. Section 58-69-301 is amended to read:
150	58-69-301. License required License classifications Anesthetic and analgesic
151	permits.

152	(1) A license is required to engage in the practice of dentistry[, including teledentistry,]
153	or dental hygiene, except as specifically provided in Section 58-69-306 or 58-1-307.
154	(2) The division shall issue to individuals qualified under the provisions of this chapter
155	a license in the classification:
156	(a) dentist; or
157	(b) dental hygienist.
158	(3) A permit is required to engage in administration of [anesthesia or analgesia] an
159	anesthetic or analgesic in the practice of dentistry or dental hygiene.
160	(4) The division in collaboration with the board shall establish by rule:
161	(a) the classifications of [anesthesia and analgesia] anesthetic and analgesic permits
162	and the scope of practice permitted under each permit; and
163	(b) the qualifications for each classification of [anesthesia and analgesia] anesthetic
164	and analgesic permit.
165	Section 3. Section 58-69-501 is amended to read:
166	58-69-501. Unlawful conduct.
167	"Unlawful conduct" includes, in addition to the definition in Section 58-1-501:
168	(1) administering [anesthesia or analgesia] an anesthetic or analgesic in the practice of
169	dentistry or dental hygiene if the individual does not hold a current permit issued by the
170	division authorizing that individual to administer the type of [anesthesia or analgesia]
171	anesthetic or analgesic used;
172	(2) practice of dental hygiene by a licensed dental hygienist when not under the general
173	or indirect supervision of a dentist, [or under a written agreement with a dentist who is licensed
174	under this chapter and who is a Utah resident, in accordance with the provisions of this
175	chapter] in accordance with Section 58-69-801; or
176	(3) directing or interfering with a licensed dentist's judgment and competent practice of
177	dentistry.
178	Section 4. Section 58-69-801 is amended to read:
179	58-69-801. Dental hygienist Practice settings Supervision Practice
180	restrictions Collaborative practice agreement not required.
181	(1) [A dental hygienist] An individual licensed under this chapter as a dental hygienist
182	may [only] engage in the practice of dental hygiene only:

183	[(1) in an accredited dental or dental hygienist school to teach and demonstrate the
184	practice of dental hygiene;]
185	[(2) for a public health agency;]
186	[(3) under the supervision of a dentist, for an employee leasing company or temporary
187	personnel service company providing employees to a dentist or other person lawfully providing
188	dental services:]
189	[(a) under the indirect supervision of a dentist licensed under this chapter at any time
190	the dental hygienist is administering an anesthetic or analgesia as permitted under this chapter
191	or division rules made under this chapter;]
192	[(b) under the general supervision of a dentist licensed under this chapter within the
193	office of the supervising dentist and upon patients of record of the supervising dentist; and]
194	[(c) under the general supervision of a dentist licensed under this chapter, and the
195	practice is conducted outside of the office of the supervising dentist, if:]
196	[(i) the dental hygiene work performed is authorized by the supervising dentist as a par-
197	of and in accordance with the supervising dentist's current treatment plan for the patient;]
198	[(ii) no anesthetic or analgesia is used;]
199	[(iii) the supervising dentist has determined the patient's general health and oral health
200	are so that the dental hygiene work can be performed under general supervision and with an
201	acceptable level of risk or injury as determined by the supervising dentist;]
202	[(iv) the supervising dentist accepts responsibility for the dental hygiene work
203	performed under general supervision; and]
204	[(v) (A) the dental hygienist's work is performed on a patient who is homebound or
205	within a hospital, nursing home, or public health agency or institution; and]
206	[(B) the patient is the supervising dentist's patient of record and the dentist has
207	examined the patient within six months prior to the patient's receiving treatment from a dental
208	hygienist under this Subsection (3); or]
209	[(4) under a written agreement with a dentist who is licensed under this chapter and
210	who is a Utah resident if:]
211	[(a) the dental hygienist practices in a public health setting;]
212	[(b) the dentist is available in person, by phone, or by electronic communication;]
213	[(c) the agreement provides that the dental hygienist shall refer a patient with a dental

214	need beyond the dental hygiemist's scope of practice to a needsed dentist, and
215	[(d) the dental hygienist obtains from each patient an informed consent form that
216	provides that treatment by a dental hygienist is not a substitute for a dental examination by a
217	dentist.]
218	(a) (i) in the following settings:
219	(A) in the office of a dentist;
220	(B) in a public health setting;
221	(C) in a hospital; or
222	(D) in an accredited dental or dental hygienist school, but only to teach and
223	demonstrate the practice of dental hygiene;
224	(b) subject to the following supervision requirements:
225	(i) if in the office of a dentist, under the dentist's general supervision;
226	(ii) if in a public health setting, under general supervision only if the individual so
227	elects;
228	(iii) if in a hospital, under general supervision;
229	(iv) if in an accredited dental or dental hygienist school, under general supervision; and
230	(v) if administering an anesthetic or analgesic, under indirect supervision; and
231	(c) subject to the following restrictions:
232	(i) if in the office of a dentist, only with the dentist's patients of record;
233	(ii) if in a public health setting, the individual obtains from the patient written
234	confirmation that the individual has informed the patient that treatment by a dental hygienist is
235	not a substitute for a dental examination by a dentist;
236	(iii) if in a hospital, only if:
237	(A) the patient is a patient of record of the supervising dentist;
238	(B) the supervising dentist has examined the patient within the past six months;
239	(C) the supervising dentist determines that the patient's general health and oral health
240	are such that the dental hygiene work can be performed with an acceptable level of risk of
241	injury to the patient, as determined by the supervising dentist;
242	(D) as a part of and in accordance with the supervising dentist's current treatment plan
243	for the patient; and
244	(F) authorized by the supervising dentist: and

245	(iv) if administering an anesthetic or analgesic, only in the office of the dentist
246	providing indirect supervision.
247	(2) An individual licensed under this chapter as a dental hygienist is not required to
248	enter into a collaborative practice agreement with a dentist to engage in the practice of dental
249	hygiene.
250	Section 5. Section 58-69-802 is amended to read:
251	58-69-802. Practice within limits of law and competency.
252	[(1) Each individual] A dentist or dental hygienist licensed under this chapter shall
253	confine [his] the dentist's or dental hygienist's practice to those acts [or practices]:
254	[(a)] <u>(1)</u> permitted by law; and
255	[(b)] (2) in which the [individual] dentist or dental hygienist is competent by education
256	training, and experience.
257	[(2) (a) The standard of dental care a licensed dental professional provides through
258	teledentistry is the same as the standard of dental care a licensed dental professional provides in
259	a traditional physical setting.]
260	[(b) (i) A treating dentist may use teledentistry to collaborate with a dental hygienist
261	within the relevant applicable scopes of practice and under the appropriate level of dentist
262	supervision, in accordance with existing supervision laws.]
263	[(ii) A dental hygienist, other dental auxiliary, or any other teledentistry provider may
264	not carry out any duties through teledentistry that require the in-person supervision of a dentist
265	licensed under this chapter.]
266	[(c) A dentist may not conduct a dental examination using teledentistry if the standard
267	of care necessitates a traditional physical dental examination.]

269	58-69-803. Use of dental assistants.
270	[The standards] Standards regulating the use of [unlicensed individuals as] dental
271	assistants shall be established by division rule made in collaboration with the board.
272	Section 7. Section 58-69-807 is amended to read:
273	58-69-807. Complaints Rulemaking for telehealth services.
274	[(1) A dentist may provide dental services using teledentistry, including the following:
275	(a) collaborating with a licensed dental professional in the completion of the following

2/0	at a public health setting, generally with a written conaborative agreement, directly, or
277	indirectly, in accordance with this chapter:]
278	[(i) gathering diagnostic information to be used by the dentist at a remote location to
279	form a tentative basic treatment plan and provide appropriate preventive or urgent
280	prescriptions;]
281	[(ii) perform preventive dental procedures;]
282	[(iii) provide oral health education; and]
283	[(iv) perform any palliative or interim treatment or caries arresting treatment outlined
284	in the dentist's treatment plan and authorized by the dentist, in accordance with this chapter and
285	rules made in accordance with this chapter; and]
286	[(b) at a remote location, using records and diagnostic information that a dental
287	hygienist provides to form a tentative treatment plan for basic dental procedures.]
288	[(2)] (1) A [licensed dental professional] dentist or dental hygienist, or [any] an entity
289	employing a [licensed dental professional] dentist or dental hygienist, may not require a patient
290	to sign an agreement that limits the patient's ability to file a complaint with the division.
291	[(3) When a licensed dental professional uses teledentistry, the licensed dental
292	professional shall ensure informed consent covers the following additional information:]
293	[(a) a description of the types of dental care services provided through teledentistry,
294	including limitations on services;]
295	[(b) the name, contact information, licensure, credentials, and qualifications of all
296	dentists and dental hygienists involved in the patient's dental care; and]
297	[(c) precautions and protocols for technological failures or emergency situations.]
298	[(4)] (2) [The] Subject to Title 26, Chapter 60, Telehealth Act, the division, in
299	collaboration with the board, shall make rules, in accordance with Title 63G, Chapter 3, Utah
300	Administrative Rulemaking Act, [to establish requirements and parameters regarding
301	teledentistry to ensure the safe use of teledentistry, including additional provisions for]
302	governing the use of telehealth services by a dentist or dental hygienist, including rules
303	addressing:
304	(a) [transparency, disclosure, and informed consent;] informed consent, which shall
305	include disclosure to the patient of:
306	(i) the types of telehealth services the dentist or dental hygienist will provide and any

307	<u>limitations of those services;</u>
308	(ii) the names, contact information, licensure, credentials, and qualifications of those
309	providing the services;
310	(iii) protocols and precautions taken to address potential technology failures or
311	emergency situations;
312	(b) [standards] standards of care;
313	(c) proper documentation of services;
314	[(d) supervision and scope of practice;]
315	[(e)] (d) patient complaints; and
316	[(f)] (e) protocols for referrals.
