NOTICE OF BILL RETURNED TO RULES COMMITTEE

February 28, 2023

Mr. Speaker,

The Law Enforcement and Criminal Justice Committee has returned **H.B. 354**, FIREARM ACCESS AMENDMENTS, by Representative A. Stoddard to the Rules Committee and with the following amendments:

- 1. Page 1, Lines 11 through 17:
 - 11 This bill:
 - 12 ▶ defines terms;
 - provides that a firearm shall be securely stored or rendered inoperable by a locking
 - 14 device; and
 - sets penalties for violations { ; and } ...
 - 16 \rightarrow \{-\text{provides that if a person accesses an unlocked firearm and commits a crime, the}
 - 17 owner may be criminally liable.
- 2. Page 2, Lines 47 through 56:
 - 47 (4) If a restricted person, a minor, or an at-risk person gains access to a firearm
 - 48 <u>belonging to or under the control of an owner or authorized user, and the owner or authorized</u>
 - 49 <u>user failed to secure the firearm in a locked container or by a locking device, the owner or</u>
 - 50 <u>authorized user in control of the firearm:</u>
 - 51 (a) is subject to a civil fine of \$1,000; or
 - 52 (b) if the restricted person, minor, or at-risk person commits a crime or injures another

- 53 person, is subject to a civil fine of \$5,000 { in addition to being guilty of an offense one level
- 54 <u>below the offense charged against the restricted person, minor, or at-risk person</u>
