Mr. Speaker,

The Public Utilities, Energy, and Technology Committee reports a favorable recommendation on **H.C.R. 9**, CONCURRENT RESOLUTION CONCERNING THE SHUTDOWN OF UTAH'S POWER BY THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT, by Representative M. Schultz, with the following amendments:

- 1. Page 1, Lines 10 through 12:
 - This resolution highlights the state's need to protect and defend against federal
 - government regulations that jeopardize the state's right to an affordable, reliable, and
 - 12 { sustainable } dispatchable energy supply.
- 2. *Page 1, Lines 21 through 23:*
 - 21 WHEREAS, the state has employed to great success a measured, all-of-the-above
 - energy policy that has powered decades of prosperity and provided some of the nation's most
 - 23 reliable {-and affordable-} __, affordable, and dispatchable_ energy;
- 3. *Page 2, Lines 33 through 34:*
 - WHEREAS, the closure of these certain power plants will put the state's supply of
 - reliable, affordable, and dispatchable power at significant risk { within a few years -};
- 4. Page 2, Lines 43 through 45:
 - BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Legislature and the Governor will support and
 - 44 defend our right, as a state's right, to an affordable, reliable, and {-sustainable-}
