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18	Be it enacted by the Legislature of the state of Utah:		
19	Section 1. Section 41-1a-203 is amended to read:		

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- 20 41-1a-203. Prerequisites for registration, transfer of ownership, or registration 21 renewal.
- (1) (a) (i) Except as provided in [Subsection (1)(b)] Subsections (1)(b) and (1)(c), the 22 23 division shall mail a notification to the owner of a vehicle at least 30 days before 24 the date the vehicle's registration is due to expire.
 - (ii) The division shall ensure that mailing of notifications described in Section (1)(a)(i) begins as soon as practicable.
 - (b) (i) The division shall provide a process for a vehicle owner to choose to receive electronic notification of the pending expiration of a vehicle's registration.

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29		(ii) If a vehicle owner chooses electronic notification, the division shall notify by
30		email the owner of a vehicle at least 30 days before the date the vehicle's
31		registration is due to expire.
32		(c) If at the time the owner renews the vehicle registration, the previous registration
33		period has been expired at least 270 days, the division is not required to comply with
34		the notification requirement described in Subsection (1) for the next registration
35		period.
36	(2)	Except as otherwise provided, before registration of a vehicle, an owner shall:
37		(a) obtain an identification number inspection under Section 41-1a-204;
38		(b) obtain a certificate of emissions inspection, if required in the current year, as
39		provided under Section 41-6a-1642;
40		(c) pay property taxes, the in lieu fee, or receive a property tax clearance under Section
41		41-1a-206 or 41-1a-207;
42		(d) pay the automobile driver education tax required by Section 41-1a-208;
43		(e) pay the applicable registration fee under Part 12, Fee and Tax Requirements;
44		(f) pay the uninsured motorist identification fee under Section 41-1a-1218, if applicable;
45		(g) pay the motor carrier fee under Section 41-1a-1219, if applicable;
46		(h) pay any applicable local emissions compliance fee under Section 41-1a-1223; and
47		(i) pay the taxes applicable under Title 59, Chapter 12, Sales and Use Tax Act.
48	(3)	In addition to the requirements in Subsection (1), an owner of a vehicle that has not
49		been previously registered or that is currently registered under a previous owner's name
50		shall apply for a valid certificate of title in the owner's name before registration.
51	(4)	The division may not issue a new registration, transfer of ownership, or registration
52		renewal under Section 73-18-7 for a vessel or outboard motor that is subject to this
53		chapter unless a certificate of title has been or is in the process of being issued in the
54		same owner's name.
55	(5)	The division may not issue a new registration, transfer of ownership, or registration
56		renewal under Section 41-22-3 for an off-highway vehicle that is subject to this chapter
57		unless a certificate of title has been or is in the process of being issued in the same
58		owner's name.
59	(6)	The division may not issue a registration renewal for a motor vehicle if the division has
60		received a hold request for the motor vehicle for which a registration renewal has been
61		requested as described in:
62		(a) Section 72-1-213.1; or
