4 General Description:

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5 This bill authorizes the Utah Homeless Network Steering Committee to develop a funding

6 formula.

7 Highlighted Provisions:

8 This bill:

- 9 requires the Utah Homeless Network Steering Committee to develop a funding formula
- 10 for the provision of homeless services;
- 11 describes the criteria the Utah Homeless Network Steering Committee shall use in 12 developing a funding formula for the provision of homeless services;
- requires the Utah Homelessness Council to approve any funding formula developed by
- the Utah Homeless Network Steering Committee by a two-thirds vote;
 - requires the state homelessness coordinator to utilize an approved funding formula in disbursing funds for the provision of homeless services; and
- 17 makes technical changes.

	Section 1. Section 35A-16-202 is amended to read:
	35A-16-202 . Powers and duties of the office.
((1) The office shall, under the direction of the coordinator:
	(a) assist in providing homeless services in the state;
	(b) coordinate the provision of homeless services in the state; [and]
	(c) manage, with the concurrence of Continuum of Care organizations approved by the
	United States Department of Housing and Urban Development, a Homeless
	Management Information System for the state that:
	(i) shares client-level data between state agencies, local governments, and private
	organizations that provide services to homeless individuals and families and
	individuals at risk of homelessness in the state;
	(ii) is effective as a case management system;
	(iii) except for individuals receiving services who are victims of domestic violence,
	includes an effective authorization protocol for encouraging individuals who are
	provided with any homeless services in the state to provide accurate information
	to providers for inclusion in the HMIS; and
	(iv) meets the requirements of the United States Department of Housing and Urban
	Development and other federal requirements[-] ; and
	(d) provide support to the steering committee in developing the formula described in
	Section 35A-16-208.
((2) The office may:
	(a) by following the procedures and requirements of Title 63J, Chapter 5, Federal Funds
	Procedures Act, seek federal grants, loans, or participation in federal programs; and
	(b) for any federal program that requires the expenditure of state funds as a condition for
	participation by the state in a fund, property, or service, with the governor's approval,
	expend whatever funds are necessary out of the money provided by the Legislature
	for the use of the office.
	Section 2. Section 35A-16-203 is amended to read:
	35A-16-203. Powers and duties of the coordinator.
((1) The coordinator shall:

62 (a) coordinate the provision of homeless services in the state;

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- (b) in cooperation with the homelessness council, develop and maintain a
 comprehensive annual budget and overview of all homeless services available in the
 state, which homeless services budget shall receive final approval by the
 homelessness council;
 - (c) in cooperation with the homelessness council, create a statewide strategic plan to minimize homelessness in the state, which strategic plan shall receive final approval by the homelessness council;
 - (d) in cooperation with the homelessness council, oversee funding provided for the provision of homeless services, which funding shall receive final approval by the homelessness council, including funding from the:
 - (i) Pamela Atkinson Homeless Account created in Section 35A-16-301;
 - (ii) Homeless to Housing Reform Restricted Account created in Section 35A-16-303; and
 - (iii) Homeless Shelter Cities Mitigation Restricted Account created in Section 35A-16-402;
 - (e) provide administrative support to and serve as a member of the homelessness council;
 - (f) at the governor's request, report directly to the governor on issues regarding homelessness in the state and the provision of homeless services in the state; and
 - (g) report directly to the president of the Senate and the speaker of the House of Representatives at least twice each year on issues regarding homelessness in the state and the provision of homeless services in the state.
 - (2) The coordinator, in cooperation with the homelessness council, shall ensure that the homeless services budget described in Subsection (1)(b) includes an overview and coordination plan for all funding sources for homeless services in the state, including from state agencies, Continuum of Care organizations, housing authorities, local governments, federal sources, and private organizations.
- 89 (3) The coordinator, in cooperation with the homelessness council, shall ensure that the 90 strategic plan described in Subsection (1)(c):
- 91 (a) outlines specific goals and measurable benchmarks for minimizing homelessness in 92 the state and for coordinating services for individuals experiencing homelessness 93 among all service providers in the state;
 - (b) identifies best practices and recommends improvements to the provision of services to individuals experiencing homelessness in the state to ensure the services are

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96	provided in a safe, cost-effective, and efficient manner;
97	(c) identifies best practices and recommends improvements in coordinating the delivery
98	of services to the variety of populations experiencing homelessness in the state,
99	including through the use of electronic databases and improved data sharing among
100	all service providers in the state; and
101	(d) identifies gaps and recommends solutions in the delivery of services to the variety of
102	populations experiencing homelessness in the state.
103	(4) In overseeing funding for the provision of homeless services as described in Subsection
104	(1)(d), the coordinator:
105	(a) shall prioritize the funding of programs and providers that have a documented history
106	of successfully reducing the number of individuals experiencing homelessness,
107	reducing the time individuals spend experiencing homelessness, moving individuals
108	experiencing homelessness to permanent housing, or reducing the number of
109	individuals who return to experiencing homelessness; [and]
110	(b) except for a program or provider providing services to victims of domestic violence,
111	may not approve funding to a program or provider that does not enter into a written
112	agreement with the office to collect and share HMIS data regarding the provision of
113	services to individuals experiencing homelessness so that the provision of services
114	can be coordinated among state agencies, local governments, and private
115	organizations[-] <u>; and</u>
116	(c) if the homelessness council has approved a funding formula developed by the
117	steering committee, as described in Section 35A-16-205:
118	(i) except as provided in Subsection (4)(c)(ii), shall utilize that funding formula in
119	disbursing funds for the provision of homeless services; and
120	(ii) shall ensure that any federal funds not subject to the funding formula are
121	disbursed in accordance with any applicable federal requirements.
122	(5) In cooperation with the homelessness council, the coordinator shall update the annual
123	statewide budget and the strategic plan described in this section on an annual basis.
124	(6) (a) On or before October 1, the coordinator shall provide a written report to the
125	department for inclusion in the department's annual written report described in

127	(b) The written report shall include:
128	(i) the homeless services budget;

144	(1) The homelessness council:
145	[(1)] (a) shall provide final approval for:
146	[(a)] (i) a funding formula developed by the steering committee under Section
147	<u>35A-16-208;</u>
148	(ii) the homeless services budget;
149	[(b)] <u>(iii)</u> the strategic plan; and
150	[(e)] (iv) the awarding of funding for the provision of homeless services as described
151	in Subsection 35A-16-203(1)(d);
152	[(2)] (b) in cooperation with the coordinator, shall:
153	[(a)] (i) develop and maintain the homeless services budget;
154	[(b)] (ii) develop and maintain the strategic plan; and
155	[(e)] <u>(iii)</u> review applications and approve funding for the provision of homeless

167	individuals experiencing homelessness;
168	[(6)] (f) shall recommend performance and accountability measures for service providers,
169	including the support of collecting consistent and transparent data; and
170	[(7)] (g) when reviewing and giving final approval for requests as described in
171	Subsection 35A-16-203(1)(d):
172	[(a)] (i) may only recommend funding if the proposed recipient has a policy to share
173	client-level service information with other entities in accordance with state and
174	federal law to enhance the coordination of services for individuals who are
175	experiencing homelessness; and
176	[(b)] (ii) shall identify specific targets and benchmarks that align with the strategic
177	plan for each recommended award.
178	(2) (a) In approving a funding formula, as described in Subsection (1)(a)(i), the
179	homelessness council shall take action on a proposed funding formula by a two-thirds
180	vote.
181	(b) If the homelessness council cannot approve a proposed funding formula, the
182	homelessness council shall refer the proposed funding formula back to the steering
183	committee for further consideration.

185	35A-16-207. Duties of the steering committee.
186	(1) The steering committee shall:
187	[(1)] (a) support connections across continuums of care, local homeless councils, and
188	state and local governments;
189	[(2)] (b) coordinate statewide emergency and crisis response in relation to services for
190	individuals experiencing homelessness;
191	[(3)] (c) provide training to providers of services for individuals experiencing
192	homelessness, stakeholders, and policymakers;
193	[(4)] (d) educate the general public and other interested persons regarding the needs,
194	challenges, and opportunities for individuals experiencing homelessness; and
195	[(5)] (e) make recommendations to the homelessness council regarding the awarding of
196	funding for the provision of homeless services as described in Subsection 35A-16-203
197	(1)(d).

198	(2) The steering committee shall, in consultation with members of the homelessness
199	council, the office, members of local homelessness councils, and the coordinator,
200	develop a funding formula as described in Section 35A-16-208.

202	<u>35A-16-208</u> . Funding formula.
203	(1) The steering committee shall develop a formula for the distribution of funds for the
204	provision of homeless services.
205	(2) A formula for the distribution of funds for the provision of homeless services shall:
206	(a) take into consideration:
207	(i) the various needs of regions of the state;
208	(ii) metrics and evidence of success;
209	(iii) the goals outlined in the strategic plan; and
210	(iv) any other factor the steering committee considers necessary; and
211	(b) utilize objective metrics to ensure, as much as possible, an impartial result.
212	(3) A funding formula described in this section applies to federal funds received by the
213	office for the provision of homeless services only insofar as any federal regulations
214	governing those federal funds allow.
