**(1)**}76-6-202.2. Interruption of a connected service in the commission of a

<u>burglary.</u>

(1) (a) As used in this section {;}:

(i) "{connected}Burglary" means an offense under Section 76-6-202.

(ii) "Connected service" means electrical, Internet, or telephone service.

(b) Terms defined in Sections 76-1-101.5 and 76-6-201 apply to this section.

(2) An actor commits {aggravated} interruption of a connected service in the

<u>commission of a burglary if</u>, in attempting, committing, or fleeing from a burglary, the actor for another participant in the crime:

(a) causes bodily injury to [any person] an individual who is not a participant in the

crime;

(b) uses or threatens the immediate use of a dangerous weapon against [any person] an individual who is not a participant in the crime; [or]

(c) possesses or attempts to use [any] an explosive or a dangerous weapon[.]; or

(d) <u>knowingly</u> damages, disables, or interrupts a connected service.

(3) A violation of Subsection (2) is a <u>{first}third</u> degree felony.

Section 2. Effective date.

This bill takes effect on May 1, 2024.
