The individual may wear one or a combination of the following that are primarily 90 hunter orange to achieve the 400 square inches: 91 (a) a hat; 92 (b) a shirt; 93 (c) a jacket; 94 (d) a coat; 95 (e) a vest; or 96 (f) a sweater. 97 (b) A person shall wear hunter orange material on the head, chest, and back.] 98 [(3) A person] 99 (2) An individual is not required to wear [the] hunter orange material described in 100 Subsection  $\left[\frac{(2)}{(1)}\right]$ 101 (a) during the following types of hunts, unless a centerfire rifle hunt is in progress in 102 the same area: 103 (i) archery; 104 (ii) muzzle-loader; 105 (iii) mountain goat; 106 (iv) bighorn sheep; 107 (v) bison; or 108 (vi) moose; or (b) as provided by a rule of the Wildlife Board made in accordance with Title 63G. 109 110 Chapter 3, Utah Administrative Rulemaking Act. (3) The director may regulate the wearing of hunter orange by an individual who is: 111 (a) not hunting, such as a hiker, camper, or other recreational user; and 112 (b) accessing a wildlife management area while a centerfire rifle hunt for big game is in 113 114 progress on the wildlife management area. 115 Section 3. Effective date. 116 This bill takes effect on May 1, 2024. 117
