33	Be it enacted by the Legislature of the state of Utah:
34	Section 1. Section 53F-5-222 is enacted to read:
35	53F-5-222. Advanced Degree Scholarship Pilot Program.
36	(1) As used in this section:
37	(a) "Advanced degree" means a master or doctoral level degree.
38	(b) "Eligible educator" means an educator as the term is defined in Section 53E-6-102.
39	(c) "Program" means the Advanced Degree Scholarship Pilot Program created in
40	Subsection (2).
41	(2) There is established a five-year pilot program known as the the Advanced Degree
42	Scholarship Pilot Program to provide financial assistance to educators for the pursuit of
43	advanced degrees.
44	(3) Subject to Section 53F-9-204, the state board shall award a scholarship to an
45	eligible educator who:
46	(a) pursues an advanced degree in education;
47	(b) submits an application to the state board;
48	(c) submits a letter of recommendation from the principal of the qualified applicant's
49	school;
50	(d) subject to Subsection (4), is enrolled in an advanced degree program from:
51	(i) an institution of higher education within the state system of higher education
52	described in Section 53B-1-102; or
53	(ii) a private, non-profit institution of higher education in the state that is accredited by
54	the Northwest Commission on Colleges and Universities; and
55	(e) will complete the advanced degree program no later than three years from the day
56	on which the advanced degree program begins.

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57	(4) For purposes of Subsection (3)(d), the state board shall determine the advanced
58	degrees that qualify for a scholarship award.
59	(5) The state board shall determine the amount of the scholarship award, ensuring that
60	the amount does not exceed the combined costs of tuition, fees, and required textbooks.
61	(6) The state board shall make rules in accordance with Title 63G, Chapter 3. Utah
62	Administrative Rulemaking Act, to:
63	(a) create a scholarship application process and appeal process for the program;
64	(b) establish criteria for awarding a scholarship;
65	(c) require a scholarship recipient to use the scholarship award exclusively for the
66	purposes of pursuing an advanced degree described in this section; and
67	(d) establish policies and procedures for cancellation or repayment of scholarship
68	awards if the scholarship recipient fails to meet the requirements under this section.
69	(7) If an appropriation under this section is insufficient to cover the costs associated
70	with the program, the state board may:
71	(a) reduce the amount of the scholarship award; and
72	(b) distribute scholarship awards on a pro rata basis to all eligible educators who
73	submitted a completed application before the application deadline.
74	Section 2. Section 53F-9-204 is amended to read:
75	53F-9-204. Public Education Economic Stabilization Restricted Account.
76	(1) There is created within the Uniform School Fund a restricted account known as the
77	"Public Education Economic Stabilization Restricted Account."
78	(2) (a) Except as provided in Subsection (2)(b), the account shall be funded from the
79	following revenue sources:
80	(i) 15% of the difference between, as determined by the Office of the Legislative Fiscal
81	Analyst:
82	(A) the estimated amount of ongoing Income Tax Fund and Uniform School Fund
83	revenue available for the Legislature to appropriate for the next fiscal year; and
84	(B) the amount of ongoing appropriations from the Income Tax Fund and Uniform
85	School Fund in the current fiscal year; and
86	(ii) other appropriations as the Legislature may designate.
87	(b) If the appropriation described in Subsection $(2)(a)$ would cause the ongoing

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88	appropriations to the account to exceed 11% of Uniform School Fund appropriations described
89	in Section 53F-9-201.1 for the same fiscal year, the Legislature shall appropriate only those
90	funds necessary to ensure that the ongoing appropriations to the account equal 11% of Uniform
91	School Fund appropriations for that fiscal year.
92	(3) Subject to the availability of ongoing appropriations to the account, in accordance
93	with
94	Utah Constitution, Article X, Section 5, Subsection (4), the ongoing appropriation to the
95	account shall be used to fund:
96	(a) except for a year described in Subsection (3)(b), one-time appropriations to the
97	public education system; and
98	(b) the Minimum School Program for a year in which Income Tax Fund revenue and
99	Uniform School Fund revenue are insufficient to fund:
100	(i) ongoing appropriations to the public education system; and
101	(ii) enrollment growth and inflation estimates, as defined in Section 53F-9-201.1.
102	(4) (a) The account shall earn interest.
103	(b) All interest earned on account money shall be deposited in the account.
104	(5) On or before December 31, 2023, and every three years thereafter, the Office of the
105	Legislative Fiscal Analyst shall:
106	(a) review the percentages described in Subsections (2)(a)(i) and (2)(b); and
107	(b) recommend to the Executive Appropriations Subcommittee any changes based on
108	the review described in Subsection (5)(a).
109	(6) In preparing budget bills for a given fiscal year, the Executive Appropriations
110	Committee shall make the one-time appropriations described in Subsection (3)(a) by
111	appropriating at least the lesser of 10% of the total amount of the one-time appropriations or:
112	(a) the cost of providing 32 paid professional hours for teachers in accordance with
113	Section 53F-7-203[.]; or
114	(b) the cost of pursuing an advanced degree or certification for educators in accordance
115	with Section 53F-5-222.
116	Section 3. FY 2025 Appropriation.
117	The following sums of money are appropriated for the fiscal year beginning July 1,
118	2024, and ending June 30, 2025. These are additions to amounts previously appropriated for

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119	fiscal year 2025.
120	Subsection 3(a). Expendable Funds and Accounts.
121	The Legislature has reviewed the following expendable funds. The Legislature
122	authorizes the State Division of Finance to transfer amounts between funds and accounts as
123	indicated. Outlays and expenditures from the funds or accounts to which the money is
124	transferred may be made without further legislative action, in accordance with statutory
125	provisions relating to the funds or accounts.
