	Section 1. Section 26B-4-711 is amended to read:
	26B-4-711. Residency grant program.
	(1) As used in this section:
	(a) "D.O. program" means an osteopathic medical program that prepares a graduate to



28	obtain licensure as a doctor of osteopathic medicine upon completing a state's licensing
29	requirements.
30	(b) "M.D. program" means a medical education program that prepares a graduate to
31	obtain licensure as a doctor of medicine upon completing a state's licensing requirements.
32	(c) "Residency program" means a program that provides training for graduates of a
33	D.O. program or an M.D. program.
34	(2) UMEC shall develop a grant program where a sponsoring institution in Utah may
35	apply for a grant to establish a new residency program or expand a current residency program.
36	(3) An applicant for a grant shall:
37	(a) provide the proposed specialty area for each grant funded residency position;
38	(b) identify where the grant funded residency position will provide care;
39	(c) (i) provide proof that the residency program is accredited by the Accreditation
40	Council for Graduate Medical Education; or
41	(ii) identify what actions need to occur for the proposed residency program to become
42	accredited by the Accreditation Council for Graduate Medical Education;
43	(d) identify how a grant funded residency position will be funded once the residency
44	program exhausts the grant money;
45	(e) agree to implement selection processes for a residency position that treat applicants
46	from D.O. programs and applicants from M.D. programs equally;
47	(f) agree to provide information identified by UMEC that relates to post-residency
48	employment outcomes for individuals who work in grant funded residency positions; and
49	(g) provide any other information related to the grant application UMEC deems
50	necessary.
51	(4) UMEC shall prioritize awarding grants to new or existing residency programs that

53	(a) address a workforce shortage, occurring in Utah, for a specialty; or
54	(b) serve an underserved population, including a rural population.
55	(5) (a) An applicant that receives a grant under this section may apply, every two years,
56	to renew the grant for two years.
57	(b) An applicant to renew a grant under Subsection (5)(a) shall provide a statement

64	November 1 of each year, UMEC shall provide a written report to the Higher Education
65	Appropriations Subcommittee describing:
66	(a) which sponsoring institutions received a grant;
67	(b) the number of residency positions created; and
68	(c) for each residency position created:
69	(i) the type of specialty;
70	(ii) where the residency position provides care; and
71	(iii) an estimated date of when a grant funded residency position will no longer need
72	grant funding.
