27	(1) As used in this section:
28	(a) "D.O. program" means an osteopathic medical program that prepares a graduate to
29	obtain licensure as a doctor of osteopathic medicine upon completing a state's licensing

(d) provide any information related to the grant application UMEC deems necessary for
awarding the grant; and
(e) if awarded the grant, agree to:
(i) enter into a contract with the Department of Corrections that the applicant will
provide for the provision of forensic psychiatry services to an individual:
(A) who needs psychiatric services; and
(B) is under the Department of Corrections' jurisdiction; and
(ii) ensure that any individual hired to provide forensic psychiatry services will comply
with all relevant:
(A) national licensing requirements; and
(B) state licensing requirements under Title 58, Occupations and Professions.
