8	General Description:
9	This bill repeals provisions related to the state flag, establishes a state flag, and creates a
10	process by which the state flag may be modified in the future.
11	Highlighted Provisions:

13	 repeals current and future provisions related to the state flag;
14	establishes a state flag;
15	 requires the Legislature to pass a joint resolution with the text of an opinion
16	question before modifying the state flag;
17	 requires the lieutenant governor to submit an opinion question to the voters in a
18	general election;
19	provides a severability clause; and
20	 makes technical changes.
