2122	Be it enacted by the Legislature of the state of Utah:
23	Section 1. Section 41-1a-1321 is enacted to read:
24	41-1a-1321. Counterfeit airbags.
25	(1) As used in this section:
26	(a) "Airbag" means an airbag passive restraint system that:
27	(i) operates in the event of a crash; and



28	(ii) meets applicable federal safety standards for the specific make, model, and year of
29	the motor vehicle in which the airbag is installed.
30	(b) "Counterfeit airbag" means a replacement motor vehicle passive restraint system o
31	a component of a replacement motor vehicle passive restraint system that displays an identical
32	or similar trademark to the manufacturer's or supplier's genuine trademark without
33	authorization.
34	(c) "Nonfunctional airbag" means a replacement motor vehicle airbag passive restraint
35	system that:
36	(i) was previously deployed or damaged;
37	(ii) has a fault that is detected by the vehicle diagnostic system after the installation
38	procedure is completed; or
39	(iii) includes any part or object installed in a motor vehicle to mislead the owner or
40	operator of the motor vehicle into believing that a functional airbag has been installed.
41	(d) "Person" includes the owner or lessee of a motor vehicle, a body shop, dealer,
42	remanufacturer, salvage rebuilder, vehicle service maintenance facility, or an entity or
43	individual engaged in the repair of motor vehicles or the replacement or repair of an airbag
44	passive restraint system.
45	(2) A person may not, with criminal negligence, manufacture, import, sell, offer for
46	sale, install, or reinstall a counterfeit or nonfunctional airbag.
47	(3) (a) Except as provided in Subsection (3)(b), a violation of Subsection (2) is a class
48	A misdemeanor.
49	(b) A violation of Subsection (2) is a second degree felony if the person causes:
50	(i) serious injury, as defined in Section 76-1-101.5, to an individual;
51	(ii) substantial injury, as defined in Section 76-1-101.5, to an individual; or
52	(iii) the death of an individual.
53	Section 2. Effective date.
