This joint resolution of the Legislature proposes to amend the Utah Constitution to
modify a provision relating to the public education system.
Highlighted Provisions:
This resolution proposes to amend the Utah Constitution to:
► limit the public education system to children who are citizens of the United States
or legal residents of the United States.
Special Clauses:
This resolution directs the lieutenant governor to submit this proposal to voters.
This resolution provides a contingent effective date of January 1, 2025 for this proposal.
Utah Constitution Sections Affected:
AMENDS:
ARTICLE X, SECTION 1
Be it resolved by the Legislature of the state of Utah, two-thirds of all members elected to each
of the two houses voting in favor thereof:
Section 1. It is proposed to amend Utah Constitution, Article X, Section 1, to read:
Article X, Section 1. [Free nonsectarian schools.]

The Legislature shall provide for the establishment and maintenance of the state's

28	education systems including: (a) a public education system, which shall be open to all children
29	of the state who are citizens or legal residents of the United States; and (b) a higher education
30	system. Both systems shall be free from sectarian control.
31	Section 2. Submittal to voters.
32	The lieutenant governor is directed to submit this proposed amendment to the voters of
33	the state at the next regular general election in the manner provided by law.
34	Section 3. Contingent effective date.
35	If the amendment proposed by this joint resolution is approved by a majority of those
36	voting on it at the next regular general election, the amendment shall take effect on January 1,
37	<u>2025.</u>
