{79-4-304. Board rulemaking authority.}

- (1) [Rules made by the board shall be made] The board} 79-4-1002. Veteran access to state parks.
- (1) The division shall make rules, in accordance with Title 63G, Chapter 3, Utah Administrative Rulemaking Act .
 - (2) (a) The board may make rules:
 - (i) governing the use of the state park system;
 - (ii) to protect state parks and their natural and cultural resources from misuse or

damage, including watersheds, plants, wildlife, and park amenities; and

- (iii) to provide for public safety and preserve the peace within state parks.
- (b) To accomplish the purposes stated in Subsection (2)(a), the board may [enact] make rules that:
