	(5) "Hazardous agricultural occupation" means any occupation defined as hazardous by

	[(4)] (6) "Hazardous occupation" is any occupation defined as hazardous by the United
Sta	tes Department of Labor under 29 U.S.C. Sec. 201 et seq., the Fair Labor Standards Act.
	[(5) "Minor" is a person under the age of 18 years.]
	(7) "Labor Day" means the legal holiday called Labor Day established in Section
630	<u>G-1-301.</u>
	(8) "Minor" means an individual under 18 years old.
	(9) "Minor's school district" means the public school district in which a minor resides
wh	ile the minor is employed.
	(10) "School day" means any calendar day in which students are required to attend
sch	ool, including a partial day, in a minor's school district.
	(11) "School week" means any calendar week in which students are required to attend
sch	ool, including a partial day, in a minor's school district.
	Section 2. Section 34-23-202 is amended to read:
	34-23-202. Employment of minors under 16 during school hours Hours of work

57	limited.
58	(1) A minor under [the age of 16] 16 years old may not be employed or permitted to
59	work during school hours except as authorized by the proper school authorities.
60	(2) [A] Except as provided in the exemptions described in 29 U.S.C. Sec. 213 and the
61	exceptions described in 29 C.F.R. Sec. 570.35:
62	(a) a minor under [the age of 16] 16 years old may not be permitted to work:
63	[(a) before or after school in excess of four hours a day;]
64	[(b) before 5:00 a.m. or after 9:30 p.m., unless the next day is not a school day;]
65	[(c) in excess of eight hours in any 24-hour period; or]
66	[(d) more than 40 hours in any week.]
67	(i) more than three hours in one school day;
68	(ii) more than 18 hours in one school week;

81	[(c) public messenger service;]
82	[(d)] (c) janitorial and custodial service;
83	[(e)] <u>(d)</u> lawn care;
84	[(f)] (e) the use of approved types of vacuum cleaners, floor polishers, [power] lawn

95	[(3)] <u>(2)</u> baby-sitting;
96	[(4)] (3) [nonhazardous] agricultural [work] occupations that are not hazardous
97	agricultural occupations; and
98	[(5)] (4) any other occupation not determined harmful by the division.

100	34-23-206. Permitted occupations for minors 10 or older.
101	Minors 10 years [of age] old or older may work in occupations such as:
102	(1) delivery of [handbills, newspapers, advertising, and advertising samples;]
103	newspapers to consumers;
104	[(2) shoe-shining;]
105	[(3) gardening and lawn care involving no power-driven lawn or snow removal
106	equipment;]
107	[(4)] <u>(2)</u> caddying; and
108	[(5)] (3) any occupation not determined harmful by the division.
109	Section 6. Section 34-23-207 is amended to read:
110	34-23-207. Permitted occupations with no specific age limitations or restrictions.
111	With consent of the minor's parent, guardian, or custodian, no specific age limitations
112	or restrictions are imposed and the restrictions described in Section 34-23-202 do not apply for
113	(1) home chores and other work done for parent or guardian;
114	(2) any casual work not determined harmful by the division;
115	(3) an agricultural [work including the operation of power-driven farm machinery in
116	the production of agricultural products] occupation that is not a hazardous agricultural
