Mr. President,

The Judiciary, Law Enforcement, and Criminal Justice Committee recommends **S.B. 104**, CHILDREN'S DEVICE PROTECTION ACT, by Senator T. D. Weiler, be replaced and reports a favorable recommendation on **1st Sub. S.B. 104**, CHILDREN'S DEVICE PROTECTION ACT with the following amendments:

- 1. Page 3, Lines 64 through 70:
 - 64 (1) (a) An adult individual, other than the parent or legal guardian of the minor in possession
 - of a device, who disables the filter required under Section 78B-6-2602 on a device in
 - 66 possession of a minor for the purpose of disseminating pornography to the minor, commits a class A misdemeanor.
 - (b) For each offense, the violator is subject to fines up to \$5,000.
 - 68 (2) Any person who has a prior conviction under this section, is guilty of a felony of
 - 69 the third degree and shall, for each separate offense, be fined amount not to exceed \$50,000 and may be
 - 70 <u>imprisoned for</u> { <u>up to one year</u> } <u>zero to five years</u> .
- 2. Page 4, Lines 91 through 93:
 - 91 <u>deactivate, modify, or uninstall a filter on a device.</u>

 (9) (a)"Retailer" means a person, that is not a manufacturer, that sells a device directly to consumers.
