The Judiciary, Law Enforcement, and Criminal Justice Committee recommends S.B. 104, CHILDREN'S DEVICE PROTECTION ACT, by Senator T. D. Weiler, be replaced and reports a favorable recommendation on 1st Sub. S.B. 104, CHILDREN'S DEVICE PROTECTION ACT with the following amendments:

1. Page 3, Lines 64 through 70 :

64 (1) (a) An adult individual, other than the parent or legal guardian of the minor in possession

65 of a device, who disables the filter required under Section 78B-6-2602 on a device in possession of a minor for the purpose of disseminating pornography to the minor, = commits a class A misdemeanor.
(b) For each offense, the violator is subject to fines up to $\$ 5,000$.
